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PUC Denies Rail Tariff Increases

Public Utilities Commissioner Howard Morgan Tuesday ordered suspension within Oregon of several railroad tariff increases filed last month with the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Morgan said the new tariffs provide increases in charges covering diversion and reconignment of freight and apply to both intrastate and interstate traffic.

They were published to become effective Feb. 1 and an accompanying petition to Interstate Commerce Commission seeks authority to establish them without suspension or public hearings to determine their propriety and reasonableness.

"While the proposed new tariffs are varied," Morgan commented, "it can be said that the increased charges would range from 30 to 80 per cent—depending on the type of service."

Morgan said that neither the tariff, nor any petition has been filed by railroads with the Public Utilities Commissioner seeking authority to make the increases effective on Oregon intrastate traffic.
