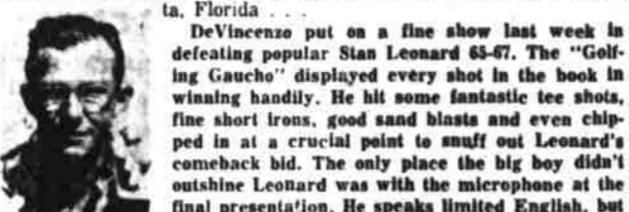

McMullin Tops Houston Golfers

HOUSTON, Feb. 18 (AP)—John McMullin, 22-year-old Californian, won medalist honors a second straight week today, posting a late three-under-par 69 to lead the qualifying round of play for the \$30,000 Houston Classic Invitation Golf Tournament.

McMullin's 69 for the 7,200-yard, par 72 Memorial Park Course left him two strokes ahead of Hans Merrell, Mogadore, Ohio, Mike Dietz, Lake Orion, Mich., Warren Smith, San Antonio, Tex., and Bob Fraimay Willamette, Ill.

McMullin and the four tied at 71 were the only qualifiers for the Texas Open at San Antonio. A three-over-par 75 or better was needed to qualify for Thursday's opening round of the 11th annual 72-hole tournament. A total of 49 qualified, including a 13-way tie at 75, thus boosting the Thursday field to 134.

McMullin finished with a 72-hole 288 at San Antonio, out of the money.

"I was playing better today and believe I'll do better here," the Fair Oaks, Calif., pro said.

Giant Manager Seeks Major League Catcher

PHOENIX, Ariz., Feb. 18 (AP)—The San Francisco Giants are in the market for a catcher.

"We've been talking trade," said manager Bill Rigney, "but it's sure tough to swing a deal."

"We asked Cincinnati about Ed Bailey. They said we could have him for Johnny Antonelli—even up."

"Well, until recently I considered Johnny and Willie Mays our two untouchables. Let's face it, Johnny is still a tremendous pitcher—one of the very best in the league."

"But I would consider trading him if we could really help ourselves by the deal. And by helping ourselves, I mean we would have to get two guys who could play everyday for us."

Ridney expects a hot battle for the catching job right in his own camp.

Valmy Thomas stepped in and showed a lot of potential last year as a rookie. He hit .249 and had only six home runs, but five of the homers won games for the Giants.

Ray Katt is a veteran receiver but he has never matched his minor league batting exploits in the major. Nick Testa is up from Dallas for another try. Testa had been in the Giants chain since 1947.

He's never impressed with his bat but his catching has been outstanding.

Roger McCardell showed good power at Sioux City last year. He hit .304 with 22 homers and 95 runs batted in.

The guy who could up with the job is the youngest catcher on the roster, 24-year-old Bob Schmidt.

Rigney said, "I was impressed with Schmidt last spring and he would have stayed with the club if he hadn't injured his shoulder."
