Payroll Tax Jump Sure Next Month

Oregon employers are assured of a big increase in payroll taxes next month because the State Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund dropped this week below its \$11.5 million "floor."

All employers will pay 2.7 percent of their payrolls, double the current average rate. In some cases it is nine times what it was last year. The bottom rate since Jan. 1 has been 6 percent.

The commission paid out \$5,811,641 in benefits during February. This was the second largest monthly total in the 21-year history of the commission and exceeded only by January's \$6,884,704.

Nine thousand persons who have exhausted their benefits can not draw any more until after July 1.

Revenue Men Shut Missile Plant to Collect Back Tax

KALAMAZOO, Mich., March 6 (AP)—A plant which manufactures parts for missiles it makes parts for jet aircraft engines.

An appeal was made to Sen. Potter (R-Mich.) and Rep. Johnson (R-Mich.) in Washington to help in reopening the plant.

The American Tool and Engineering Co. plant employs 65 machinists, tool and die makers and clerical workers. They were thrown out of work.

The industrialist, Alexander Pinto, was sentenced Monday in U.S. District Court in Grand Rapids to four years in prison on charges of income tax evasion totaling \$424,156. Pinto pleaded guilty.

Pinto, president of the firm which he built from a small shop to a large business, was taken to the federal prison at Milan, Mich., today to start serving his term. He will be eligible for parole in 16 months.

Internal Revenue Service agents placed a notice on the plant entrance forbidding anyone to enter. Employees protested their pay checks for last week were locked up inside.

Hot-Rodders to Face Charges

A gang of free-loading Woodburn hot-rodgers is being trooped into Marion County juvenile offices by sheriff's deputies on charges concerning stolen gas, oil, tires, batteries, hubcaps and other automotive supplies.

Seven boys, aged 15 to 17, have been cited to appear in court with "more on the way," said deputy Charles Thornton. Hearings will start this morning for two of the boys, said Carl Nelson, juvenile department director.

All of the thefts, which extend over a six-month period, are "on the street" type, with no forcible building entries involved. However, gasoline pump locks have been smashed, said Thornton.

Smith and Nelson Construction Co. of Salem has been awarded a \$143,717 contract to build a one-story dormitory addition and swimming pool at Oregon State School for the Blind.

Five rooms will be added to the dormitory, which now houses 30 girls. The addition will accommodate about 18 more girls.

The covered swimming pool will be an addition to the school's gymnasium. It will measure 20 by 40 feet.

Construction will start immediately, the builder said.

Salem De Paur Concert Shows Different Touch

The De Paur Gala of chorus, orchestra, soloists and narrator, led by Leonard De Paur, gave an intriguingly different kind of a program last evening at North Salem High auditorium. The event was the final concert of the season presented by the Salem Community Concert Association.

"Lost in the Stars," a condensation in concert form of the Weill-Anderson adaptation of Paton's novel "Cry, the Beloved Country," opened the program. With the assistance of commanding narration by Paul Westbrook and excellent dictation from soloists and chorus the impact of the gripping tragedy and final sympathy between negro and white was effectively projected.

Inez Matthews, soprano, sang with sensitive coloring. McHenry Boatwright, baritone, was particularly effective with his simple and straightforward singing and superb dictation. His nostalgic "The Little Gray House" was moving. Remembered too is the "Train to Johannesburg" by the chorus, where the men were most commanding.
