Opposition to Ending Service of Bus Voiced

AMITY—Opposition to the proposed abandonment of Greyhound bus service between McMinnville and Corvallis, a move which would directly affect the Amity area, was voiced this week by the Amity Commercial Club.
 President H. W. Torbet said Friday that the group favored a revision in scheduling of the present route rather than complete cancellation. The present Greyhound route schedule provides for a morning bus south, returning northward in the evening.
 Due to the amount of northbound passenger traffic available in the mornings, Torbet suggested reversal of the route schedule to provide a northbound morning bus, returning southward in the evening.
 A committee has been appointed to represent the Commercial Club at a public hearing on the route's abandonment, April 16. Named as delegates were Don Jones, P. E. Meeker, Glen Watts, and S. W. McPherson.

Silverton Plans Stone Erection

SILVERTON—A stone which will actually serve as a memorial to two former residents of the Monitor-Silverton country is to be erected at the pioneer Miller Cemetery near Silverton in May. Sponsors are hoping to have the stone here in time for Memorial services.
 The stone, in engraved wording will commemorate Samuel Markham, the father of Edwin Markham, one-time renowned poet. To many Monitor and Silverton folk, the stone will also commemorate the late Henry J. Anderson, who spent the last two years of his life soliciting funds to erect a stone on the unmarked grave of the father of the famous poet. The poet himself lived in the Abiqua Area just east of Silverton as a child before the family moved to California where he later became famous.
 The stone, to be of red granite, will have a 30-inch face, is to be 24 inches deep and will stand 39 inches high.
 Inscription on the stone will read: "In Memory of Samuel Markham, 1790-1878, Father of the Poet, Edwin Markham. Of all the things beautiful and good, the kindest is brotherhood." On the other side of the stone will be engraved a replica of Millet's painting which inspired the poet's most widely known poem, "The Man with the Hoe."
