Chrysler in Economy Run Lead

PHOENIX, Ariz. (U)—Mel Alsbury Jr., of Hollywood, Calif., driving a 1958 Chrysler Imperial Crown, took an early lead Sunday in the Mobilgas economy run. Alsbury, two-time winner of the economy run sweepstakes championship, scored 63.1156 miles per gallon on the 425-mile first leg from Los Angeles to Phoenix. He drove the Imperial Crown to victory in 1956 and 1957.

His actual miles per gallon for the first leg of the 1,863-mile run to Galveston, Tex., was 20.7123. Leading the group of seven low-priced cars among the 29 car field was Mary Davis of West Hollywood, Calif., in a Plymouth Belvedere, with 29.8710 miles per gallon and 20.6912 actual miles per gallon.

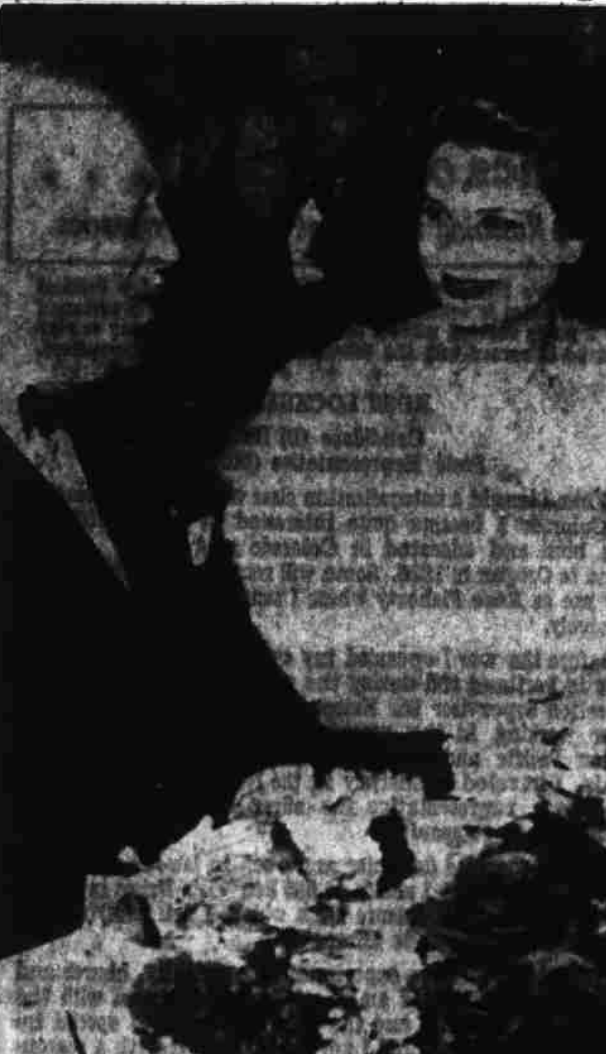
Bishop Gives Final Talk to Convention

Lana saw Cheryl Saturday. Both parents said there was no discussion during their respective talks with their daughter about the verdict of a coroner's jury Friday that the girl's fatal stabbing April 4 of her mother's boy friend, Johnny Stompanato, 32, was justifiable homicide.

"Sure, she's homesick," Crane told newsmen. "She's counting the days just like anyone else."

But Cheryl faces at least 11 more days in custody—until April 24 when she appears at a Juvenile Court hearing.

The court has several alternatives. The jurist at the private hearing could grant custody of Cheryl to one of her parents or to her maternal grandmother, Mrs. Mildred Turner. Or he could order her placed in a foster home or a state or private institution.

Another alternative, considered unlikely, is that she might be certified for trial in Superior Court, as an adult.

The verdict of the coroner's jury is not binding upon the court. (Verdict Interpretation on Page 5)

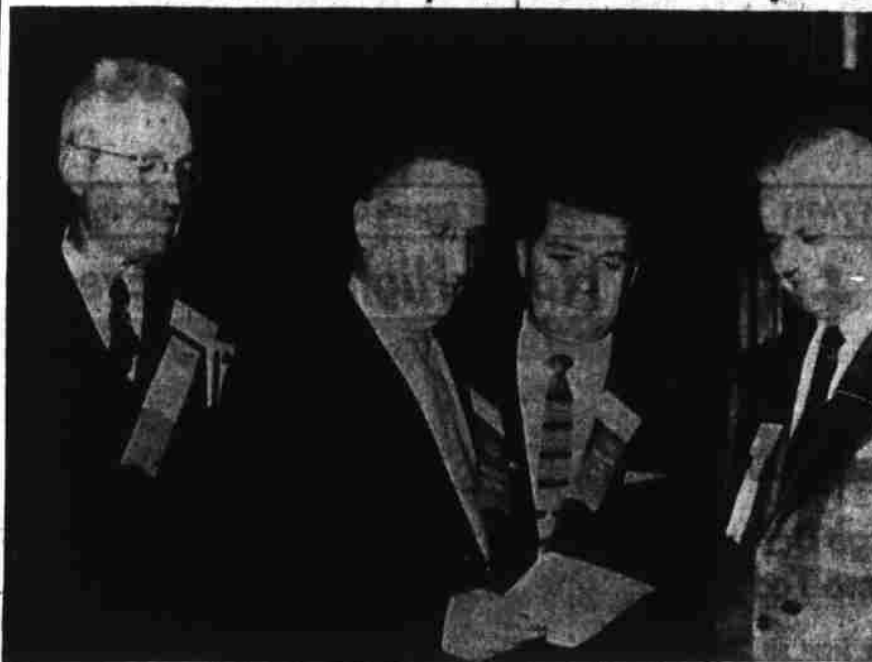

Cuban Troops Inflict Losses on Rebel Unit

HAVANA (U)—Government forces surrounded a band of Fidel Castro's rebels in Oriente province Sunday and inflicted "heavy losses," the Cuban army announced.

It was the only major action reported during the day.

The communists said the troops trapped the insurgent band as it was heading toward Guantanamo from Castro's Sierra Maestra stronghold.

Cutting off the rebels' retreat, the army engaged them in a pitched battle "during which the rebels suffered a large number of losses which are still being counted," the communists said.

"The rebels abandoned... arms, munitions and documents as well as two trucks and two jeeps," the communists continued.

"The survivors were dispersed and are being pursued by mobile patrols."

In rebellious Oriente Province, soldiers—as they have been doing since December—posted reward notices offering \$100,000 for Castro dead or alive. And as they have done since December, the rebels tore them down. About 50,000 peasants live in the foothills of the Sierra Maestra where Castro's forces are based.
