

Thousands Vote in Marion County School Elections; Summaries by Areas Tabulated

Thousands of Marion County citizens took a hand in their local school government Monday as they voted on school district directors and budgets, plus other items.

Here are summaries of the voting by districts as gathered by Statesman correspondents and other aides:

GERVAIS—Residents of this district passed a Union High School budget of \$12,542 by a vote of 85 to 54 in election Monday night. Last year's figure was \$14,847. Elected as school director was Glenn Lucas who received 82 votes. Kenneth Brown received 49 write-in votes.

PIONEER—Residents of this community Monday passed a total school budget of \$12,210 by a vote of 24 to 3. Last year's budget was \$11,930. Elected to a five-year term as school director was Bob Banick who was unopposed.

CLOVERDALE—Cloverdale Grade School District's \$23,500 budget was approved 27-5 in Monday's special vote.

Elected to a five-year term on the Cloverdale School Board was Kenneth Webb, who was unopposed.

FRUITLAND—A budget of \$10,589 in excess of the six per cent limitation won 70-33 in special voting Monday in the Fruitland Grade School District.

In contests for positions on the Fruitland school board, Ernest Campbell was elected to a two-year term and Albert Apperson to a five-year stint.

BETHLE—A. C. Spranger was re-elected to Bethel School Board Monday with 43 votes to 32 for Elvin Zeck. A \$12,000 school district budget was passed by a vote of 57 to 14.

LABISH CENTER—Willard McCloughy was elected Monday to Labish Center School Board with nine votes to eight for Robert Heilman and six for Lyle Klampe. The 1958-59 budget was approved by a vote of 20 to 2.

LAKE LABISH—A 1958-59 school district budget \$2,500 higher than this year's was approved unanimously Monday by 13 Lake Labish district voters. L. J. Wickey was elected to the school board without opposition.

SILVER CREST—Charles Tulare was elected director for School District 93C Monday. He received

14 votes to 13 for Alvin Roth. Voters also approved the school budget 26-1 calling for a levy of \$8,513 over the 6-per-cent limitation.

PRATUM—Pratum School budget of \$7,923 was accepted by a vote of 85 yes and none voting no. Albert Mantle was re-elected for a five-year term as school district director.

NORTH HOWELL—Oscar Evan was elected a North Howell school board director in Monday's elections to replace Ruben Bitchen. Evan won over James Jackson, Fred Landt and Bitchen.

Voters approved the \$13,750 budget by a vote of 27 to 2. Last year's budget was \$14,531. Mrs. Oscar Evan was re-elected as clerk for the district.

SCOTTS MILL—By a vote of 16 to 6, Scotts Mill residents passed their rural school budget of \$16,100. It was an increase of about \$5,000 over last year. Elected to a five-year term for school director was Anthony Biekenberg who was unopposed in the 73-J election.

ST. PAUL—A St. Paul School District budget of \$20,616 was approved Monday at the polls by the narrow margin of two votes—55 to 53. Max Schroeder, appointed recently to the school board, was unopposed for election.

MACLEAY—Macleay School District passed their budget of \$19,775 by a vote of 26 to 4. Carl Arneri defeated his opponent for school director, Henry Tsenig by a vote of 32 to 5. Last year's budget was \$14,304.

AUMSVILLE—Kenneth Purdy, incumbent, was re-elected Monday to Aumsville School Board by a vote of 35 to 10 over Don Gildow. Voters also approved the local school budget 38 to 8.

HUBBARD—Harlan Rehm was elected Monday night to Hubbard School Board, succeeding W. T. Lord. He was unopposed on the ballot.

Voters approved a \$72,480 school budget by 63 to 12 vote. This is an increase from the current \$66,771 budget.

SUNNYSIDE—Sunnyside School District's budget with its \$11,000 in excess of the six per cent limitation lost by a narrow 11-12 margin in Monday's special election. Budget totaled \$25,448.

Two directors unopposed for positions on the district board were

John Neuenschwander, reelected to a five-year term, and Mrs. Elaine Williams, elected to fill out term of Mrs. Edna Dutoit, who moved away.

EVERGREEN—B. E. Kimsey defeated two opponents, including incumbent Monroe Hanson, Monday for a post on Evergreen School Board. The vote was 15 for Kimsey, 9 for Hanson and 2 for Alvin Hollin.

Voters also approved an \$11,992 school budget 22 to 1. The amount is slightly lower than this year's budget.

NORTH MARION—A \$132,794 budget was approved by North Marion High School voters, by 35 to 14 vote. This compares with the present \$109,073 budget.

Clifford A. Blake, unopposed, was reelected to the school board.

JEFFERSON—A \$221,920 Jefferson School District budget for the

coming year was approved Monday by a vote of 91 to 23. Last year's budget was \$217,706.

Mervin McGill was re-elected director of the school district with 115 votes.

CENTRAL HOWELL—A budget of \$19,410 was passed by residents here Monday night by a vote of 58 to 38. Last year's budget was \$12,311. Leonard Roth, the only name on ballot, was elected to five-year term as school director.

GERVAIS—A rural grade school budget of \$20,856 by a vote of 58 to 12 in the 76-C elections Monday. Lawrence DuRatte was elected to a five-year term as school director. Last year's budget was \$17,410.

STAYTON UNION HIGH—Ward A. Inglis was re-elected to the board of Stayton Union High School District Monday. He was unopposed. The district approved its budget earlier.

Polk County Votes on Zone Directors; Ballots Cast On \$127,000 Rural School Budget, Board Members

Polk County voters balloted on local school budget and board members, a \$127,000 county school budget and school directors in two zones Monday. Here are unofficial results from the Statesman's News Service correspondents:

DALLAS—William Harlan received 148 votes for director on the county school board in Monday's election at Dallas. Ross Bowman received 24, and J. B. Emerson 11.

Overwhelming approval, 177 to 23, was given the district's \$303,566.79 budget over the taxable limitation.

Voters also named O. C. Peters to the county school board from the Dallas district. Unopposed, he drew 173 votes.

Incumbent George Kurre was returned to the local school board for a five year term. He received 171 votes. Several other names appeared on ballots as write in candidates.

ORCHARDS—Monday's school election here saw 15 to 0 favorable votes cast on both the \$127,000 rural school budget for Polk County, and an \$8,861.15 local district budget. For director on the county school board, William Harlan had 8 votes, J. B. Emerson 5, and Ross Bowman 1. For a post on district 15 board of directors, Marvin May defeated Lester Voth 15 to 3.

INDEPENDENCE—Ross Bowman was favored here in Monday's school voting for the county school board post in zone 3, received 40 votes to William Harlan's 29, and J. B. Emerson's 13. Approved 66 to 24 was the district's budget of \$129,919.27 for the coming year.

Fred Calif was unopposed for board director of district 13C, receiving 77 votes.

OAKHURST—Voters here approved the \$127,000 rural county budget 8 to 0, and the local budget by the same figure. No amount of the local budget was given. For zone 4 county board director, John Doran received 7 votes, and Vernon Murphy 2. For zone 3 director, Ross Bowman had 6, J. B. Emerson 1, and William Harlan 0.

Floyd Moore, unopposed, is local board director for a five year term.

VALSETZ—Vernon Murphy was favored over John Doran 25 to 22 locally for director from zone 4 on the Polk county rural school board. For zone 3 director, the voting showed Ross Bowman 33, William Harlan 7, and J. B. Emerson 6. The local school district budget of \$64,485.32 was approved 49 to 1.

Two directors were named on the local school board. Marvin Alstoft for 5 year term, defeating S. W. Eamons 32 to 18, and Donald Summers for 3 year term over Ralph Thompson 39 to 9.

ORCHARD VIEW—William Harlan was favored in Monday's school election as zone 4 director on Polk county rural school board with 24 votes to Ross Bowman 8, and J. B. Emerson 3.

Voters also approved the \$127,000 rural school budget 29 to 6. Two local school board members

were named, Gary Radke for a four year term, Art Classen for five years.

AMITY—Amity grade school's budget of \$33,954 was approved Monday 51 to 33, and Ray Snyder was named for two year term as school director. He was unopposed. The high school levy of \$54,775 was also approved 114 to 65.

Julius Marx Jr. was named director, defeating Merle Williams for the post 106 to 75.

POP CORN—Incomplete results of the school election found William Harlan with 11 votes for zone 3 director on the rural school board, to Ross Bowman 9, and J. B. Emerson 4.

Tally on the local budget was not listed at press time. Richard Synowski was named for a five year term on the local school board.

BALLSTON—For rural school director here, J. B. Emerson polled 23 votes in zone 3 to William Harlan 7, and Ross Bowman 3. A local school levy of \$12,343.76 was passed 25 to 8.

Elected local school director was Ezra Kilmer for five years.

BUELL—The rural school budget passed here 12 to 2, and the local school budget, figure not revealed, was 14 to 0 favorable.

For zone 3 director on the Polk county rural school board, J. B. Emerson received 11 votes, Ross Bowman 8, and William O. Harlan 0. Ernest Baller was elected local school board director for five years.

AIRLE—The \$127,000 rural school budget passed Monday 36 to 0, and the local budget of \$12,193.65 by a 34 to 2 margin. For zone 3 director on the rural school board it was Ross Bowman 19, William Harlan 8, and J. B. Emerson 6. Local school board member elected was Lyle Burk.

ANTIOCH—Voters approved the rural school budget 11 to 0, and the same margin for the local district budget of \$9,147. No tally was listed for a zone 4 director on the county school board, but for zone 3 director, it was J. B. Emerson 4, William Harlan 4, and Ross Bowman 3.

OAKDALE—By a favorable 12 to 0 vote, the rural county school budget was passed. The local budget of \$13,442 was passed 13 to 1. As directors from zone 4, John Doran got 9, Vernon Murphy 4. For director in zone 3, it was Ross Bowman 7, J. B. Emerson 3, and William Harlan 2.

Named to the local school board was Walter Howard for four years, and James Manchias for five years.

ELLIOTT PRAIRIE—Curtis Nelson, incumbent, was re-elected to a five-year position on the Elliott Prairie School District Board Monday evening. Glenn Losey received 21 write-in votes for the position.

A \$10,322 budget passed by a vote of 24 to 21.

MILL CITY—Voters of Mill City School District approved their local school budget 113 to 35 in Monday's election and also voted approval, 125 to 18, to the proposal for transferring some Linn County forest funds for capital outlay use.

Frank Moore was elected to a five-year term as director, without opposition, succeeding C. W. Stewart. Martin Hansen was favored by 113 to 31 vote over Wendell Heller for a three-year board term. He succeeds T. H. Baughman.

MILL CITY—Santham Union High voters passed their school district budget Monday night by 115 to 51 vote. The budget is \$98,544.

RICKREALL—Nineteen voters approved the school's operating budget of \$23,372.60 by a 19 to 0 margin. Last year's budget was \$20,505.79. Also approved by a 17 to 2 margin was the rural school budget of \$127,000.

For school board director, William Harlan received 16 votes, Ross Bowman 2, and J. B. Emerson 0. Elbert Rangsdaal, unopposed, was named local school board director.

EOLA—Voters in Monday's school election cast unanimous approval on both the \$127,000 rural school budget, and on the local budget exceeding the six per cent limitation by \$8,861.15.

For county school board member, William Harlan received 6 votes, Ross Bowman 5, and J. B. Emerson 1. Lawrence Buhler, unopposed, was named local school board director.

PERRYDALE—J. B. Emerson received 14 votes for the county school board post, to Ross Bowman's 1, and William Harlan's 4 in Monday's school election.

The 45 voters approved their local school budget of \$89,400, which is \$64,881.26 over the limitation. Vote was 38 yes to 7 no. Marvin

Fast, unopposed, was elected to the school board.

BRIDGEPORT—The local grade school budget of \$14,575, which is \$7,957 outside the limitation was approved 39 to 16. The non-high budget of \$127,000 was also passed 33 to 22. Zone 4 balloting on county rural school board was Vernon

Murphy 12 and John Doran 41. For director at large from zone 3, the count was Ross Bowman 31, J. B. Emerson 11, and William Harlan 10.

Local school board director post for three years went to Norval Embree, and a five year term to Ross Murphy.

MILL CREEK—This Yamhill County school district approved the county budget of \$285,035.31 by 9 to 1. The district's own budget of \$5,212 was okayed 7 to 0. In an unopposed election for the five year school board post locally, Mrs. Ralph Kadall was named, receiving five votes.

SHERIDAN—This Yamhill county school district 48-14 approved the county school budget of \$285,035.31 by a large 130 to 35 margin. In a very close race for director of the local school for a five year term, Mrs. Wilma Paulovich ousted present board chairman Harold Fuller 85 to 79.

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STAYTON—Stayton School District budget for 1958-59 was accepted Monday by district voters 74 to 29. Lawrence Smith, unopposed, was re-elected to the school board.

CROOKED FINGER—The local school budget was passed by residents here Monday. George Helvey, an unopposed candidate for school director, was elected by 17 votes.

DETROIT—Warren Stoll was elected to a three-year term as director of the Detroit School District Monday with 71 votes.

Vern Morgan received 65 votes to take a five-year term as director and the school budget carried by a vote of 101 to 21.

WEST STAYTON—Boyd Hilton was re-elected to West Stayton district school board Monday and the district budget of \$14,703 was approved by a 91 to 11 vote. The budget was down slightly from the past year's \$15,506.

VICTOR POINT—The Victor Point Grade School District budget of \$45,767 won by a 117-55 verdict in voting here Monday. The budget was about \$4,000 under last year's.

Elected unopposed to five-year position on the district board was Donald Jaquet and Robert Humphreys was unopposed for a seat on Silverton Union High Board.

ELDRIDGE—Eldridge School District budget of \$28,689 was approved unanimously Monday evening. Last year's budget was \$32,134.

Robert Reed was re-elected for a five-year director of the district.

BROOKS—Lloyd Drayton was unanimously elected Monday as a five-year director of the Brooks School District to succeed James Rickard.

The district school budget passed by a 36 to 5 vote, which represents a \$27,430 over the six per cent limitation.

SUBIMITY—Residents of this community passed the local school budget by a vote 119 to 56. The total budget was \$6,000 over \$5,000 less than last year. Harold Russell was elected to five-year term as school director with 95 votes. Richard Schumacher received 74 write-in votes.

WOODBURN—A combined high school and local grade school budget was passed by a vote of 264 to 161. The budget amount in the excess of six per cent limitation was

\$306,988.97. The total budget was about \$360,000. This year's budget was a small increase over last year.

Elected to a five-year term for school board director was L. H. Paulson with 383 votes. Elected to a two-year term was Robert Sawtelle with 367. Their was a total of 435.

PARKERVILLE—A local budget of \$11,697 was defeated in a close vote of 37 to 35 by residents here Monday night. This year's budget was about \$25 more than last year's figure. Joseph Pfau was unanimously elected to five-year term as school director.

BETHANY—Stephen Mead posed out Hugh Boehmer for Bethany School District director Monday night by a vote of 11 to 10. Leo Kallhoss received nine votes for the position and Leo Peterson seven.

The district's budget passed by a vote of 27 to 12. It represents \$7,845 over the six per cent limitation. Robert Humphrey received 38 votes for Silverton Union High School school board member.

MONITOR—Erwin Nickodemus was elected for a five-year term on the Monitor School District Board Monday evening. The district's budget was approved by a vote of 29 to 25.

TURNER—Turner Grade School District voters Monday approved the district budget \$7-43 and also passed a bond issue for a new school by an 87-40 count.

Lester Bones was elected to a four-year term on the district board.

SILVERTON—A Silverton school district budget of \$175,603 was passed by Silverton residents here Monday by a vote of 221 to 82. The budget was \$80,878 over the six per cent limitation.

Dr. Norman Dods with 213 votes defeated William Williams who received 122 votes for position on the district board.

MT. ANGEL—Mt. Angel residents passed their local school budget of \$83,135 by a vote of 115 to 61 Monday. Elected to an unexpired term of three years for school director was Bernard Kirsch with 125 votes. Elected to a five-year term was Richard Foltz with 146 votes.

AURORA—Voters of Aurora Grade School District Monday approved the \$77,887 district budget by a 24-12 count.

Leonard Peters was named to a five-year term on the district board.

CLEAR LAKE—District 122 residents here defeated their local school budget of \$35,454 by one vote Monday. Emil Beier with 43 write-in votes was elected as local school board director for a five-year term.

UNION—Residents here passed their local school budget of \$6,533 over the six per cent limitation by vote of 34 to 17. Gordon Seely was re-elected to the local school board.

DONALD—Budget of Donald Grade School District won by a 17-3 margin Monday. The budget totaled \$18,175.

Elected unopposed to a five-year term on the district board was Arnold Iverson.

EVERGREEN—Evergreen School District elected B. E. Kimsey director Monday evening with 15 votes.

The district budget passed by a vote of 24 to 1, representing \$4,313 over the six per cent limitation. Robert Humphrey received 26 votes for Silverton Union High School board member and Robert Riches one vote.
