

Polk Planners Give Nod To Street Number Plan

DALLAS, Ore. — Tentative approval for extension of Salem's street naming and numbering system into West Salem was given Wednesday night by the Polk County Planning Commission.

A public hearing was set for June 16 at 8 p.m. in Polk County Courthouse. The system would abolish present rural route designations in the area served by Salem Postoffice. Final approval would come from County Court.

It was announced Wednesday that Polk County's building code is held up pending a decision from the state attorney general as to whether forest, agriculture and

range lands remain.

The building code, which also would be submitted to County Court for approval, would tie in with subdivision ordinances which are being considered by the commission.

Letters have been mailed to most Polk County cities with a copy of Salem's recently adopted subdivision ordinance for study pending a meeting of representatives to consider the plan.

The commission accepted the resignation of Ben Maxwell, member from Eola. A committee was appointed to suggest a replacement, who will be chosen by the County Court.

Possibility of state improvement of Salem-Dallas Highway appeared slim Wednesday when a letter was read from W. C. Williams, State Highway Engineer. The letter stated that there are "no plans for major relocation of any highways in Polk County."

No Action on Arterials
Tentative maps of a network of major arterials and collector streets for the county were presented at the meeting, but no action was taken. They showed little realignment or new construction.

A letter was read requesting the commission to prepare necessary studies for zoning of the recently formed Wallace-Sheridan-Orchard Heights zoning district. The matter was referred to a committee for possible referral to Mid-Willamette Valley Planning Council.

The commission set the third Monday at 8 p.m. of each month as the regular meeting date.

Lumber Union Sticks With Pay Demand

PORTLAND — A 31-cent package pay raise will continue to be demanded by the Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union, a union spokesman said Wednesday.

The union Wednesday held its first contract negotiating session with employers' groups since its rival, the International Woodworkers of America, decided in a surprising move last Friday to extend its present contract one year.

The IWA gave the current recession in the lumber industry as the reason for its move.

Immediately after the announcement, the LSWU said the IWA's action would have no effect on LSWU demands.

Earl Hartley, the LSWU's Western head, said the demands were being pushed.

The union wants increased pay and health, welfare and vacation benefits totaling 31 cents an hour. Hourly wages now range between \$1.85 and \$1.92.

The LSWU has been taking strike votes in its locals, nearly all of which favor a strike if needed, the union said.

Between 50,000 and 60,000 workers in the Northwest belong to the LSWU, while the IWA represents about 45,000.

Democratic Governor Contest Undecided in Alabama Primary

Vote counting in Tuesday's primaries in Alabama, Ohio and Indiana still left undecided Wednesday night Democratic races for governor and control of the Democratic party machinery in Alabama.

Next week's official canvass and a run-off election June 3 will decide the contests in the Southern states.

Meanwhile, a veteran member of the House from Alabama, Democratic Rep. George M. Grant was in a tight race with State Rep. Wilbur Nolen of Montgomery, for renomination. The count was still incomplete.

In Ohio, Republican Rep. Thomas A. Jenkins, who is serving his 34th year in the House of Representatives, was defeated for renomination by a little more than 600 votes, but he had withdrawn after the ballots were printed and did not campaign. He is ill in a Bethesda, Md., hospital.

Jenkins ran second to former State Rep. Homer Abele in a three-man race. Although not a true test of Jenkins' popularity, it was the first defeat for an incumbent House member in five years.

He was chosen last Saturday by the Lafayette board of trustees.

The Theodore Linds are now with their daughter's family in Providence, R. I., where Dr. Bergethon is dean of the college at Brown University.

He is a native of Norway, graduate of DePaul University who took his graduate work at Cornell. He has been at Brown since 1946.

In his new post he will head a 132-year-old men's college of arts, sciences and engineering with a student body of 1,500 and faculty of 145.

Mrs. Bergethon, the former Katherine Lind, and her family have frequently visited in Salem with her parents and brother, Norman Lind.

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Lady Docker in New Row With Italian Law Officers

NAPLES — Lady Norah Docker, the exiled outcast of the French-Monacan Riviera, was summoned by an Italian court Wednesday to answer charges of drunkenness and insulting a cop on Capri.

There was some confusion over the date. Reporters at Naples court at first understood it was Aug. 28, 1957.

In London Lady Docker's husband, the wealthy Sir Bernard, denied they'd set foot on the island last August. He said they had just anchored in Capri waters and their yachting friends went ashore.

That prompted a recheck of court records. This showed the charges specified the incident was in 1956, not last year.

Naples Penal Court set May 17 as the date for trial of the middle-aged playgirl who — with her husband and yacht — is barred from the French-Monacan coasts for tearing up a Monacan flag in a fit of anger.

The Italian court ruled she will be tried on two counts: 1. Outraging a public office and 2. Creating a public disturbance while drunk.

Commenting on the charges, Sir Bernard told a London reporter: "I don't know where they have got this 'from. We did not land at Capri in August. We anchored off the island, and my wife and I water-skied while our friends went ashore to look at the shops."

Man Dies of Burns
PORTLAND — Curtis Davis, 41, died in a hospital here Wednesday of burns suffered May 1.

Davis was burned over 50 per cent of his body when a bonfire flared up as he threw rubbish on it.

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Wrong Treatment Given as Antidote For Poisoning

A line left out of a Farm Page story on poison antidotes Wednesday in The Statesman caused an error which indicates an incorrect antidote.

The last sentence of Antidote 1 in the Page 11 read, "Flush eyes with water, then with phosphoric, hydrochloric and sulfuric acid."

It should read, "Flush eyes with water, then with 1-per-cent solution of sodium bicarbonate. Also use this treatment for phosphoric, hydrochloric and sulfuric acid."

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Man Who Fled With Bank Loot Loses Appeal

HOUSTON, Texas. — A man who fled with money taken in an Oregon bank robbery probably will be in jail by Friday, federal court officials said here Wednesday.

The officials said an attorney for Jack Wayne Lyles, 32, told them the former sheriff's deputy would surrender late this week.

The notice was received after a U.S. Court of Appeals turned down an appeal by Lyles.

Lyles was convicted last year of taking \$22,000 and transporting it from New Orleans to Houston.

Testimony at his trial indicated that Lyles took the money from one of two men who robbed a Umatilla, Ore., bank and then fled to New Orleans. The bank was robbed Aug. 22, 1955.

To Aid Arabs
