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Jobs in Washington Becoming Habit With New Man in Cabinet

DELaware, Ohio (AP)—It's getting to be a habit for tall, wiry Arthur Sherwood Flemming.

Just as he's getting settled down in the relatively calm job as president of Ohio Wesleyan University, off he pops to Washington to tackle another government assignment. (Story also on page 3.)

His latest is secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

President Eisenhower has picked Flemming to succeed outgoing Secretary Marion Folsom.

In a way, it will almost be like going home for Flemming, a veteran Washington hand who has spent nearly half his life in the nation's capital.

His most recent stint was as director of the Office of Defense Mobilization from 1953 until February 1957. His job automatically made him a member of the National Security Council and, as such, he was among the select few to sit in at presidential Cabinet meetings.

His move to the directorship of the ODM took him away completely from Ohio Wesleyan. For two years before that he was assistant to the director of defense mobilization, but somehow managed to stay at the helm of the Methodist school he has headed since 1948.

It was a gruelling schedule. On weekends he'd fly back here and put in two days of conferences with faculty members and committees, and perform any other work that required his attention.

His capacity for hard work is probably his outstanding characteristic, his friends say. Apart from his official duties here or in Washington, Flemming heads, or is a member of, a score or more of civil, governmental and private organizations.

How does he do it? A keen, perceptive mind, for one thing, those who know him say. A certain Spartan discipline in his personal behavior, for another. He drinks no coffee, tea or other stimulants. And, come what may, he gets eight hours of sleep a day.

Conjure up the standard prototype of a statesman and you've pictured Flemming—tall, closely clipped gray hair, conservative dresser, a deep resonant voice that commands the listener's attention.

Flemming became Ohio Wesleyan's president Sept. 1, 1948, after some 21 years as an educator, government official, and newsmen in Washington.

He was on the editorial staff of the U.S. Daily, now the U.S. News & World Report, from 1930 to 1934; and was editor of Uncle Sam's Diary, a weekly current events newspaper for high school pupils, from 1932-1935.

During part of that time he had doubled as an instructor at American University in Washington, and was its director from 1934-1939.

From 1939 until he came to Ohio Wesleyan, Flemming served as Republican member of the Civil Service Commission. He was appointed by former President Roosevelt.

He has served also in various capacities with the Labor Department, Atomic Energy Commission, the United Nations, and the Defense Department.

Flemming also served on the Hoover Commission studying the organization of the executive branch of the government. His work on the naval manpower survey board earned him the Distinguished Civilian Service award.

Flemming was born June 12, 1906, in Kingston, N.Y., the son of Judge and Mrs. Harry Flemming. He received his A.B. degree from Ohio Wesleyan in 1927, his M.A. degree from American University in 1928, and an LL.B. degree from George Washington University in 1933. Ohio Wesleyan, American University, Temple, Wesleyan and Oberlin colleges have conferred LL.D. degrees upon him.

Flemming married the former Bernice V. Moler in 1934. They have five children, Elizabeth Ann, Susan Harriet, Harry Sherwood, and twins, Henry and Thomas Madison.

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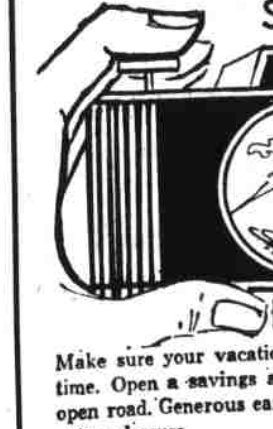
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
