

Government Investigating Indictment of Rep. Powell

NEW YORK (AP) — The government Friday launched a probe of possible influence in the indictment of Rep. Adam Clayton Powell (D-N.Y.) on charges of income tax evasion. The indicting grand jury reportedly was produced into action.

U.S. Atty. Paul W. Williams named as targets of his inquiry William Buckley, editor of the "Weekly National Review," and Thomas A. Bolan, a former as-

stant U.S. attorney in Williams' office.

Buckley was subpoenaed for federal grand jury questioning next Tuesday. Bolan was not immediately summoned.

Williams has been smarting under reports that the Powell grand jury was stirred into action when the Justice Department was reluctant to go after the Negro congressman from Harlem. Williams has denied the jury ran away on him.

The probe of Powell's affairs had lain dormant 14 months before it suddenly was reopened last April 17. Thursday, the jury indicted Powell on three counts of evading \$3,063 in 1951-52 taxes, on his own income and that of his wife, pianist Hazel Scott. That jury then was dismissed.

Had the grand jury held off until next September, the statute of limitations would have taken effect — which means that Powell could not be prosecuted since the time in which an alleged crime

may be punished would have elapsed.

Critical of Shelving
Last December, Buckley's National Review carried an article critical of the lengthy shelving of the Powell case. Copies were mailed to each of the 23 grand jurors on the Powell case.

Buckley freely admitted violating a federal law against contacting jurors on matters pending before them. He said: "We're not reluctant to take credit for stirring the grand jury up."

Radio's Bill Goodwin Found Dead in Car



PALM SPRINGS, Calif. (AP) — Bill Goodwin, above, radio announcer and actor, died Friday in his car near Palm Springs, Calif., apparently of a heart attack. He was 47.

His wife, former movie actress Philippa Hilber, said they retired about 12:30 a.m. She awoke during the night and found a note from Goodwin which read: "Gone to take a ride out in the desert for awhile."

Police said a heart attack apparently killed him. Dr. R. S. Dexter, county pathologist, explained that the cause of death could not be determined by a preliminary postmortem examination and called for further laboratory tests.

He gave permission for cremation, however, and Mrs. Goodwin said private cremation, with no services, would take place at 1 p.m. Saturday.

Goodwin owned the Nooks Hotel in Palm Springs and drove to Hollywood for his radio and television work.

Bob Hope, who worked with Goodwin from 1938 to 1945, said in New York he was shocked by the announcer's sudden death. "He was in perfect health the last time I saw him," said Hope. "He was a bright young guy. . . It's just shocking."

Husky and hearty, with voice and grin to match, Goodwin also had his own radio and TV shows, including a radio program with his wife. Since September he had been host on television's filmed "Colgate Theater." He signed recently to announce the forthcoming "Gerald McBoing Boing" show on CBS-TV.

Besides his wife he leaves four children, Jill, 18; Lynn, 14; Sally, 12; and Bill Jr., 16.

WASHINGTON (AP) — A group staging a sitdown protest against nuclear weapons tests got to see Atomic Energy Commission John S. Graham Friday but said they'd keep up their vigil at AEC headquarters at Germantown, Md.

David Dellinger, a spokesman for the group, said they hoped Graham would convey their sentiments to the entire AEC.

"However, we feel that we have not yet accomplished the purpose of bringing home to the commissioners and to the public the urgency of stopping nuclear weapons tests," he said.

Khrushchev 'Riding High'

WASHINGTON (AP) — Premier Nikita Khrushchev is still riding high as boss of the Soviet Union, in the opinion of Washington officials.

They hold to this view even though there probably are stresses and strains, and even heated policy disputes, within the Moscow leadership.

Khrushchev is regarded here as director of the very tough new policy toward Tito Yugoslavia.

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Teamsters Want Beck Out of House

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The newspaper said Local 162 here Tuesday night voted 304-0 to ask Teamsters President James Hoffa that Beck be removed from the rent-free home.

The local, which represents about 4,400 men, asked Hoffa "to deny Beck the right to live in his home rent-free or on any other Teamsters property."

The union paid \$163,000 for the home in which Beck, a former Teamsters president, now lives.

Earlier, the union ordered Beck to give up a suite of union offices in Seattle.

The union order came shortly after Beck was convicted of grand larceny and sentenced to 15 years in prison. He is appealing the conviction.

10 Norway Ships 'Seized by Reds'
