Dad Wrong to Date His Housekeeper

Dear Ann: There are three girls in our family, and I'm the oldest, 15. Last Christmas our mother passed away and we've been having a bad time ever since.
Dad hired a woman to cook and keep house. She's married, but separated from her husband. This woman moved in with her 12-year-old daughter.
Our home was beautiful when Mother was here. Now it's always untidy, the silver is never polished, and nothing is ever repaired. She can't cook a thing and we eat mostly out of cans. Her daughter uses our hi-fi and has scratched and broken several records (then denies it). Both this woman and her daughter have charged things on our bill in several stores and Dad has criticized her for it, but it doesn't help.
Dad has started to take her to the movies and they are very friendly. We are upset. Please tell us what to do—R.L.C. and D.
Your dad is lonesome—but he should NOT be mixing up his social life with (a) a woman who is married and (b) supposedly working in his home.
Tell your dad and your sisters feel this woman and her daughter are creating unhappiness in your family. If he's wise he'll give her two weeks' notice and hire a housekeeper who knows something about keeping house. And if he thinks you're too young to know what you're talking about, ask him to get an unbiased opinion from your clergyman—the one, who buried your mother.
Dear Ann: I'm a high school teacher who would like your opinion on something which has been widely discussed in our own school. I respectfully request that you print your reply in the paper as the problem has created a great deal of controversy, and it would be helpful to have it aired publicly.
Some of our students think it's perfectly all right for couples who are going steady to hold hands in the halls and walk around with their arms around one another. Couples who are fond of one another should consider how unattractive this behavior is to observers who don't have star-dust in their eyes. It looks plain vulgar.
