U.S. Marines Storm Turkey Site in Exercises

WITH THE U.S. 6TH FLEET AT DICKINSON, Turkey (AP) — A battalion of U.S. Marines stormed ashore near this Turkish coastal town Monday. It was a simulated brush-fire fighting operation.

Some Marines flew in by helicopter and others drove ashore by boat with tanks and other gear on an 11-ship flotilla.

Within hours they held a deep beachhead that could have served for withdrawal of Americans or other nationals—one of the missions of 8th Fleet is prepared for.

Aware of Situation

Most officers and men involved were aware of the situation in troubled Lebanon to the south could put the training to use.

Out to sea, the carriers Saratoga and Essex sent in wave after wave of jet support planes.

Sky Warriors simulated enemy attacks.

By dawn small detachments of reconnaissance troops and frogmen had skimmed ashore over a calm sea in rubber boats.

Later the main waves charged in from both sea and air to occupy a small, hill-ringed plain.

Within an hour 1,800 Marines, forming the 2nd Battalion of the 2nd Regiment, had tanks, bulldozers, derricks, road building equipment, and other heavy materials ashore.

Simultaneously helicopters put a 200-man company in the hills five miles back from the beach.

LONDON (AP) — An uneasy peace hung over London Monday. Maria Callas is back in town.

The tempestuous prima donna, who can stretch a tantrum from notes above high C, is one of five female stars scheduled to take part Tuesday in a gala performance marking the 100th anniversary of the Royal Opera House at Covent Garden. And that brought up problem number one.

What do you do when you have five female stars and only one dressing room with star billing?

And especially when one of those five stars is Maria Callas?

The Earl of Harewood, assistant administrator of the Royal Opera House, solved it simply. He just moved out of his office.

But he had the office refurbished as a superstar dressing room and offered it graciously to Miss Callas while the ordinary star's dressing room went to ballerina Margot Fonteyn.

Maria smiled. Margot smiled. The three other stars, Blanche Thebom, Joan Sutherland and Sylvia Fisher, said they were delighted with lesser dressing rooms anyway.

Contract Let on Harper Bend Job

PORTLAND (AP)—The Army Engineers Monday awarded a contract for construction of Willamette River bank protection works at Harper Bend, two miles north of Junction City.

The \$56,686 contract went to C. W. Hatfield and A. C. McCollister of Oregon City.

Navy Drops Plans to Build 6 New Warships

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Navy Monday dropped from its building program the planned construction of six new warships and the modernization of three others. It estimated savings at nearly half a billion dollars.

Private Utility Firms Unite on Research Job

PORTLAND (AP)—Eight privately-owned utility companies Monday said they have joined in a two-year research program aimed at two aspects of getting electric power from nuclear energy.

Three firms—Pacific Power & Light, Portland General Electric, and Washington Water Power—are from the Pacific Northwest.

Pacific Power, which announced the program here, said these are the projects: to develop gas-cooled nuclear power reactors and to study the possibilities of direct conversion of heat from electricity.

General Dynamics Corp.'s John Jay Hopkins laboratory at San Diego will direct the research, expected to cost \$500,000.

Associated with the Northwest firms are Arizona Public Service, California Electric Power, Public Service Co. of Colorado, Public Service Co. of New Mexico, and Utah Power & Light.

The utilities have formed the Rocky Mountain-Pacific Nuclear Research Group to work with General Dynamics.

Top Potential of Far-East Wheat Market Explained

THE DALLES, Ore. (AP)—The Far East represents an excellent potential market for Oregon wheat growers, Jack Smith, Condon, told a meeting of the executive committee of the Oregon Wheat Growers League here Monday.

However, Smith said, it is essential that the federal government allow Oregon wheat to compete freely on the international market if Far Eastern sales are to rise significantly.

Smith recently returned from a tour of the Far East where he investigated the area's wheat market potential.

2-Bulgarian Cabinet Men Lose Jobs

VIENNA (AP)—Two Bulgarian Cabinet ministers lost their jobs Monday in a reshuffle of the Sofia government after a Communist party congress attended by Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev.

Radio Sofia said ex-strongman Vukko Chervenkov—once a premier and first party secretary—has been dismissed from his post as education minister, but he remains a deputy premier.

Defense Minister Gen. Peter Panchevsk was the other man ousted. He will get another job the radio said.

The new defense minister is Dep. Premier Gen. Ivan Mikhailov, who gave up his ministry of transport to Dancho Dimitrov, formerly a party secretary.

It had been reported that one of Khrushchev's aims in his visit to last week's party congress was to "kill or cure" fighting in the hierarchy of the Bulgarian party. The other was to whip up satellite enmity against Yugoslavia's President Tito as a Communist heretic and "tool of the imperialists."

All-Time TV Quiz Champ Wins Again

NEW YORK (AP)—Television's all-time quiz show champion, Elfrida von Nardoff, easily pushed her winnings to \$248,000 Monday night.

Miss Von Nardoff, 32, said she plans to continue on the NBC program, "Twenty One," as long as her "spirit holds out." She has quit her job as a New York personnel consultant to devote full time to the show.

Neither of her opponents—Wolf gang Weissleder of New York City and Herbert Hulse of Goldsboro, N. C.—scored against her. But time ran out before Hulse got his second try so he will return to the show next week.

Miss Nardoff's winnings passed 31-year-old Robert Strom's last week. Strom was the previous high money winner on TV quiz shows with \$224,000 won on CBS-TV's "64,000 Question" and \$64,000 Challenge.

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
