

2-More New Teachers Hired by Dallas Board

DALLAS—Two teachers were hired by the school board of District Two this week. Recommended for hiring by Supt. Ellis Neal were Miss Carolyn Jones to take a position at the

high school, and Miss LaJuana Pike, who will teach sixth grade at Lyle school. Neal said that this brings a total of 16 new teachers in the system, which includes 11 replacement teachers and five additional instructors hired to handle the increase in students in the fall. Neal said the turnover of teachers in the district amounts to about 15 percent, well under the average of 25-30 percent in the state.

Polk Aid Needs Rise

DALLAS — Welfare budget demands during the next biennium are up \$682,728, according to Earl Loewen, Polk County welfare administrator. The budget for the two years period beginning July 1, 1959 is \$1,627,320, he said. The federal government will contribute 42 per cent or \$673,825; the state, 41 per cent or \$667,407; and the county 17 per cent, \$286,088.

Law Douses 'Fiery Love'

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — The flaming love affair of Earl Powell has been doused by the fire department. Instead of seeing a parson, he's charged with arson. Powell, 42, turned in an alarm from a box outside the empty apartment of his girl friend. He told firemen smoke was coming from the apartment. They became suspicious because they could not see smoke from the outside, rushed in and put out a fire in a mattress. Powell told Police Court he got mad at his girl and set the mattress afire just for revenge. He was jailed in lieu of \$1,000 bond on an arson charge.

A delegation from the Dallas Smileroo asked if the board would allow a vote on a bond issue to build a swimming pool. The board indicated that the permission would be forthcoming when a little more information was received from the Smileroo as to the size of the issue, location, specifications and other information. Plans call for a pool to cost in the neighborhood of \$100,000 and to be operated by the school board.

World Fair Studied

TORONTO (AP)—Canadian National Exhibition officials are studying the possibility of holding a world fair in Toronto. But there is a long time to wait. Brussels is conducting the 1958 exhibition. World fairs are regulated by international agreement and held not more than once every six years.

Capone Gang Member Gets 9-Year Term

CHICAGO (AP) — Paul (The Waiter) Ricca, one of the few surviving members of the old Capone gang, was sentenced Thursday to nine years in prison and fined \$15,000 for income tax evasion.

The 60-year-old crime syndicate veteran was convicted May 29 of failing to pay \$39,000 in taxes for 1948, 1949 and 1950. The government used the net worth technique in winning the conviction. It showed he could not live in the lavish manner he does on the low income reported.

Ricca, who came to the United States from Italy in 1928 and worked as a restaurant waiter until he made profitable connections, is fighting deportation to his homeland. He is appealing a federal court order revoking his citizenship.

Judge Julius H. Miner of U.S. District Court assessed the punishment for the tax evasion. The maximum would have been 15 years in prison and a \$30,000 fine.

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Pioneer Daughter Dies

Mrs. Gray died at 63 Saturday at San Bernardino, Calif., where she had lived for 20 years.

She was born Jan. 5, 1895 at Independence, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Sperling, who, with his brothers operated a meat packing house. Her uncle, August, founded the first Independence hotel.

Mrs. Gray was a nurse in Salem until the age of 21 when she and her husband left for Indio, Calif., to take over the management of a hospital.

Survivors include two sons Russell M. Gray Jr., Crestline, Calif.

Gray, Reno, Nev.; two daughters, Mrs. Ann Van Epps, San Antonio, Tex.; and Mrs. Kay Henderson, San Bernardino, Calif.; three brothers, Herman Sperling, Boise, Idaho; Arthur Sperling, Eugene; and Carl Sperling, Vale; one sister, Mrs. Alice Shambarger, Yorba Linda, Calif.; and several cousins in the Salem area.

Services are under the direction of Clough-Barrick Mortuary, Salem.

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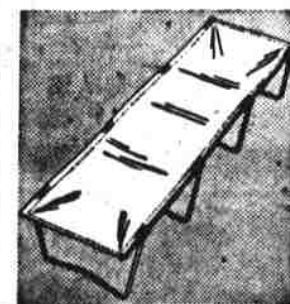
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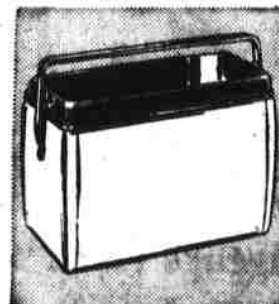


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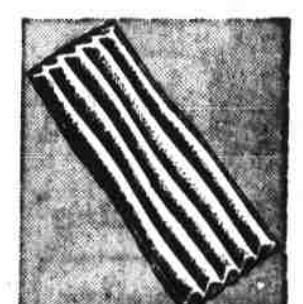
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
