In a thunderstorm in 1946, and Frank Stranahan, the muscled young spark plug heir of Toledo, Ohio.

Tied at 73, just two strokes off the pace, were 22-year-old Bruce Crampton of Australia and Jimmy Demaret of Kiamesha Lake, N.Y., the golfing grandpa who at 48 is seeking his first open triumph.

Crampton, a 150 complained of playing conditions and, like Sarazen, leveled his strongest attack at pin placements. "They were impossible on some holes," said the handsome Sydney golfer. "I would have thought that with the wind and heat and all, the committee would have been more charitable."

An amateur, Harvie Ward of San Francisco, two-time winner of the national amateur championship, was in the thick of contention going into the second round Friday. Harvie, who has just served a year's suspension for expense account irregularities, shot a 74 which placed him in a tie with Gene Littler of El Cajon, Calif., Smiley Quick of Whittier, Calif., and Labron Harris of Stillwater, Oklahoma State University golf coach.

Other scores ranged 75 and up and high as the 94, recorded by amateur Joe Rociccano of New York's Bronx, who took ten strokes on the par five 15th.

Bolt, the reformer club thrower who says he has found a new peace of mind in his game, was first in with his 71. The pug-faced one-time caddy, Oklahoma-born, Louisiana-reared and now Florida located (Crystal River), played steady golf, getting off to a birdie start with a 20-foot putt on the first hole.

Then in the locker room he blasted what he called "gallery favoritism" and said Snead was given a big advantage because of it.

"The fans line the fairways and keep Sam Snead from getting in trouble," said Bolt. "You'd think he was a giant, different from the rest of us. You'd think he jumped into his trousers instead of putting them on one leg at a time."

Metz, who led the 1938 open at Denver's Cherry Hills before blowing it to Ralph Guldahl with a final round 79, quit golf for three years to do some ranching in Kansas. Recently he returned to Shady Oaks in Fort Worth, Tex., as a working and playing pro.

K. C. Jones to Play Football

LOS ANGELES (AP) — K. C. Jones, a former basketball star with the University of San Francisco, has been signed by the Los Angeles Rams of the National Football League.

Coach Sid Gillman said Thursday that he plans to use Jones at defensive halfback next season.

Jones did not play football at USC. In basketball he teamed with the great Bill Russell on the "Dons" National Collegiate championship squad and on the 1950 United States Olympic team.

In Boston, Walter Brown, president general manager of Boston Garden and half owner of the Celtics basketball team, said he would hold Jones to a contract to play with the Boston team. "This is the first I've heard of this," he said, when told of the signing of Jones by the Rams. "He can't do it. He's under contract to us. As far as the football draft goes, he never played in college, so it's unlikely that anyone claimed him. He may be wide open on that."

"But he's locked up with us. We don't want him risking his basketball future in pro football."

Carter vs. Besmanoff In Heavyweight Battle

NEW YORK (AP)—Harold Carter, ranked among the top contenders in the heavyweight division before he entered the Army 18 months ago, returns to the ring Friday night to box Willi Besmanoff, a German import, at Madison Square Garden.

Although Carter is heavily favored he can not afford to take Besmanoff too lightly. The German was just another unknown European when Carter went into service. In subsequent fights he has been able to hold his own against some of the leading heavies.

Besmanoff, a stocky broad-shouldered fellow, upset Pat McMurry on his home court at Seattle Feb. 4 and lost a split decision to Archie Moore, the light heavy king, on a derby eve in Louisville.

If Carter can take up where he left off, he soon may be pounding on the door of Floyd Patterson, the heavyweight champ. Presumably he isn't barred from boxing the champ as he never was offered a shot at the title and turned it down. Cus d'Amato, Patterson's manager, uses that line of reasoning for checking would-be contenders.
