

Military Testimony Halted Due to 'Fear of Reprisal'

WASHINGTON (AP)—Chairman Richard B. Russell (D-Ga.) of the Senate Armed Services Committee Monday called off further testimony by military chiefs on the defense reorganization bill until he gets a promise they can give their views without fear of reprisal.

In taking this action, Russell denounced what he called totalitarian-like tactics by Secretary of Defense McElroy against Adm. Arleigh A. Burke, chief of naval operations, for criticizing the administration plan before Russell's committee.

"The clear implication in the secretary's statement is that the Joint Chiefs must conform or be purged," Russell said in a statement. "This is more in keeping with the totalitarian concept of government" than with a democracy, Russell declared.

"A witness testifying under the sword of reprisal will find it difficult to give his views."

There was no immediate comment from McElroy, who told newsmen at Quantico, Va., last weekend he regretted Burke's opposition to parts of the bill and was disappointed by the admiral's testimony. McElroy later said his remarks were not intended as a rebuke to Burke.

Russell, however, reading a prepared statement at a news conference, rejected McElroy's explanation that he had not intended to rebuke Burke.

"In these circumstances," he added, "I doubt whether further testimony from the military chiefs will contribute anything to a great understanding of the issues involved by the Congress or the people of the country."

Then Russell said he was cancelling Tuesday's scheduled appearances of two chiefs of staff unless he got "a clear and unequivocal statement from the secretary of defense" that they could speak freely.

Logging Truck, Vehicle Crash; Four Injured

WILLAMINA—Four out-of-state persons, including an 11-month-old infant, were injured Monday afternoon when a loaded log truck rolled over on their station wagon following a collision near here.

State police said the injured were Henry Bertram Jr., 22, his wife, Josephine, 21, their infant daughter, Joan, and Mrs. Bertram's mother, Mrs. Ann Gill, 60, all of Salt Lake City, Utah.

The driver, who was seriously injured with a fractured skull and broken pelvis; his wife received a fractured shoulder, pelvis; the daughter chest injuries, and Mrs. Gill, fractured pelvis and shoulder.

The injured were all taken to McMinnville hospital where supervisors said none was critical.

Officer James Williams said that the truck and station wagon collided at the west end of Wallace Bridge at the junction of Highway 22 and 18 about 2:25 p.m.

The truck carried the station wagon into a parked car before tipping on its side. The parked car, unoccupied, was registered to Miles W. Welby, 6150 Sunnyview Ave. NE, Salem.

East Oregon Fires Brought Under Control

Fires still burned over Eastern Oregon grassland Monday afternoon, but firefighters were controlling the largest blaze.

The Weather Bureau reported that cooler marine air, which brought rain and thunderstorms to inland valleys, might reach the eastern part of the state, which has had virtually no relief from the heat wave which began a week ago.

Ron Younger, assistant range manager for the Bureau of Land Management at Baker, reported two fires still burning in Eastern Oregon range areas after he made a flying trip over the region Monday afternoon.

Younger said one blaze appeared to have burned about 5,700 acres of grass in the area five miles east of Boardman and south of Highway 30. He said the fire appeared to be under control with one bulldozer working on mop-up.

A farm—with house, barn and out-buildings—was burning in a second fire south of Highway 30 and south of the town of Hinkle. Younger said he was unable to determine if the farm was occupied.

He said four pumper trucks and crews were working on the fire and he thought they could contain it. The blaze had burned an estimated 1,300 acres, including 320 acres of grain. Younger said. Winds up to 30 miles an hour and high temperatures with low humidity hampered firefighters' efforts.

Grandfather Spans Ocean Flying Plane

PALERMO, Sicily (AP)—Max Conrad, a flying grandfather, wound up a storm-plagued, 4,440-mile, nonstop flight from New York in his single-engine plane Monday night, tired but triumphant. A long radio silence had aroused fears that he had crashed.

"It was a wonderful, but very tiring adventure," said the 55-year-old father of 10 children as he clambered out of his little Piper Comanche at Palermo's Bocca di Falco Airport.

"I was caught in a tempest over the Balearics (islands east of Spain) and had to fly only 100 yards above the sea. I also ran into very strong headwinds between Sardinia and Sicily."

Conrad completed the marathon hop—his 40th and longest light-plane flight—in 32 hours, 48 minutes. The elapsed time beat his own prediction of 33 hours by 12 minutes.

The veteran amateur pilot, a native of Winona, Minn., and resident of San Francisco, arrived putty-eyed with weariness and stubble bearded.

A small crowd that gathered at the airport to welcome Conrad swept him into its shoulders and carried him off the field.

He smiled happily and told them: "Now please let me sleep."

Gerald Helmer, Sweet Home, Ore., a smoke-jumper.

C. A. Bennett, supervisor for the Okanogan National Forest, said the plane, a Beechcraft operating with a Forest Service smoke jumping unit at Winthrop, was on a routine mission dropping supplies to a crew fighting a forest fire near Eight Mile Ridge.

Teams of mechanics will "ask" embarrassing questions of hundreds of vehicles here Thursday and Friday in an annual safety check by Salem Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Senate Votes To Share Atom Secrets

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate passed in amended form Monday a bill which would permit the United States to share some of its atomic weapon secrets with friendly nations.

Sen. Clinton P. Anderson (D-NM), ranking senator on the Senate-Atomic Energy Committee, persuaded the Senate to make two changes before it approved the bill on a voice vote.

One of his amendments would limit to Great Britain the presidential authority to transfer non-nuclear parts of atomic weapons. As it came to the floor, the bill would have permitted such transfers to any friendly nation.

The other amendment knocked out a section permitting the President to furnish friendly countries data on "other military applications of atomic energy." Anderson said the purpose of the section had never been made clear.

Little Rock Judge Affirms Own Decree

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP)—A federal judge Monday refused to stay his own order delaying school integration here for 2½ years. He indirectly advised the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People to try for the stay in a higher court.

Wiley Branton, a Negro attorney for the NAACP, said he would take the cue.

"Have motion, will travel," Branton quipped.

U. S. Dist. Judge Harry J. Lemley denied Branton's motion Monday morning after hearing six minutes of oral argument and recessing court for an hour to write the opinion.

\$4,178 Taken From Co-op At Gresham

GRESHAM (AP)—Burglars took a total of \$4,178 in cash and checks this weekend from the Gresham Farmers Cooperative here, the Multnomah County sheriff's office reported Monday.

The money was taken from a locked container in an unlocked concrete fire vault, deputies said. They reported no evidence of forcible entry into the container.

Water Rates Also Received Action

Water rates also received action from the City Council.

Aldermen approved a committee-endorsed plan to charge a higher rate to households outside city limits, raising the present rate from 125 to 165 per cent of the in-city rate.

In this connection the Council also directed a city manager's review of water sales to outside districts other than the Keizer and East Salem districts. Aldermen want to make sure the rate charged to individuals is 125 per cent of the city rate, even though a reduction is possible because the district pays the 125 per cent on large-quantity basis.

Significance of the rate change is a Council policy allowing sale to outside home owners where connections with the city system are possible, even though annexation is not under consideration there.
