Dividend to Albertans

Twenty-five years ago the Province of Alberta was in bad financial straits. Its farmers were impoverished by low prices for their wheat and cattle.

In the current of resulting prosperity the Social Credit Party has reverted to its original philosophy. It is going to declare a dividend. Each adult who has lived in the province for at least five years will receive \$22.

The dividend now proposed amounts to about one-third of the annual royalties received by the province. The province retained the mineral rights on all Crown lands sold or homesteaded after 1887.
