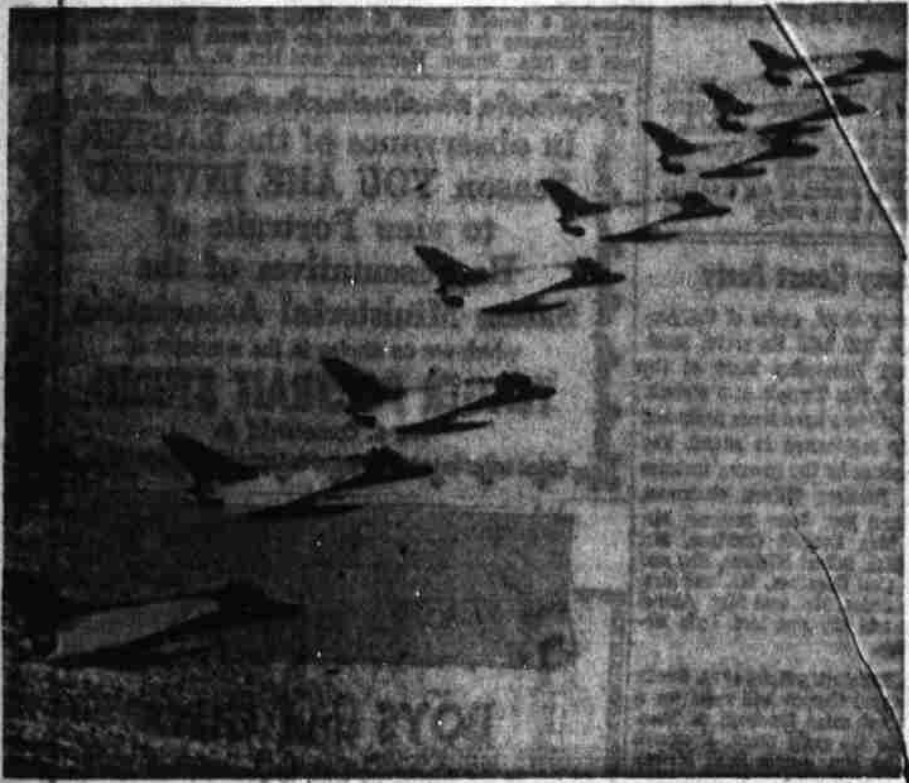


Skyrays Fill Ocean Sky

WCS Circles of Jason Lee Will Meet This Week

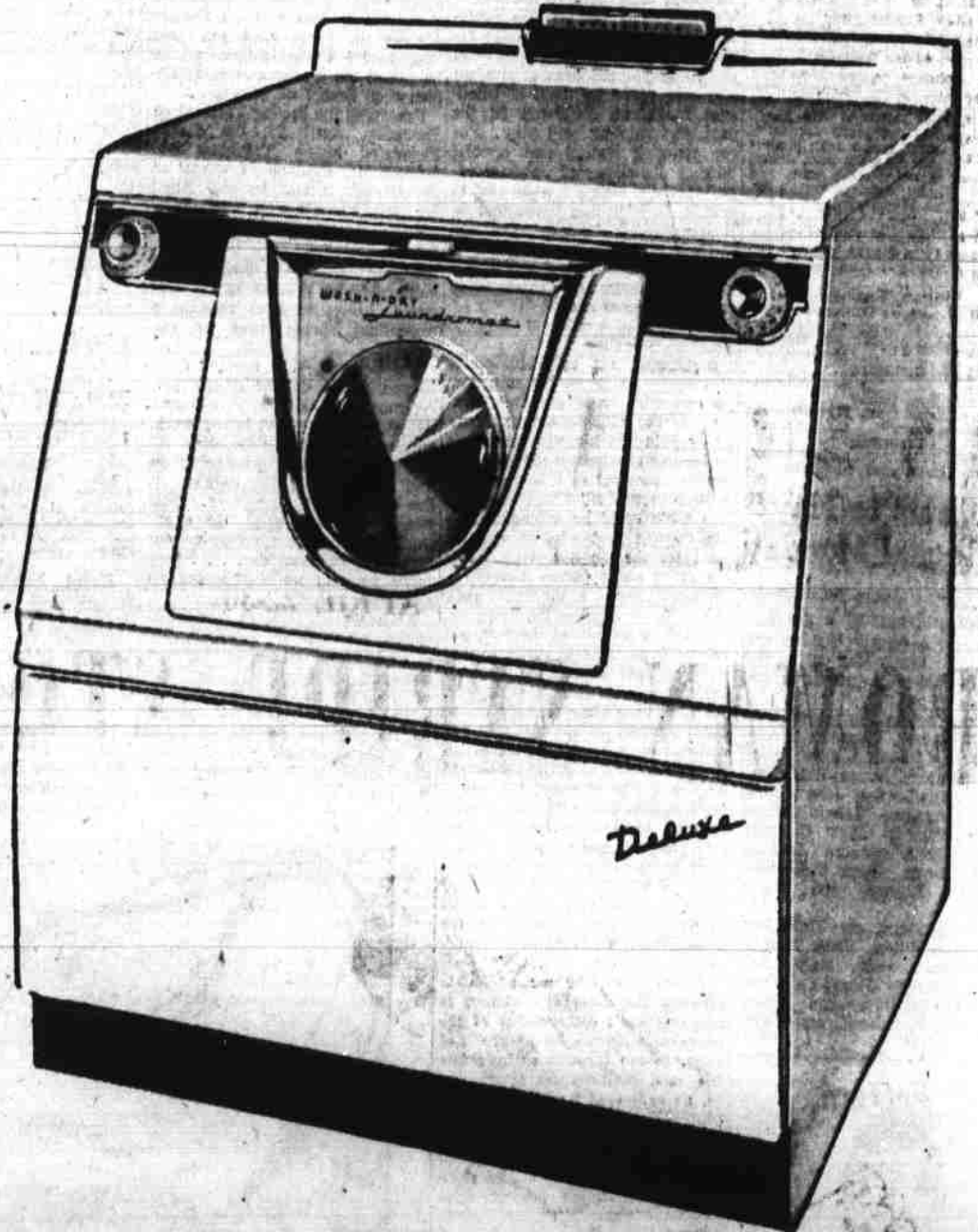

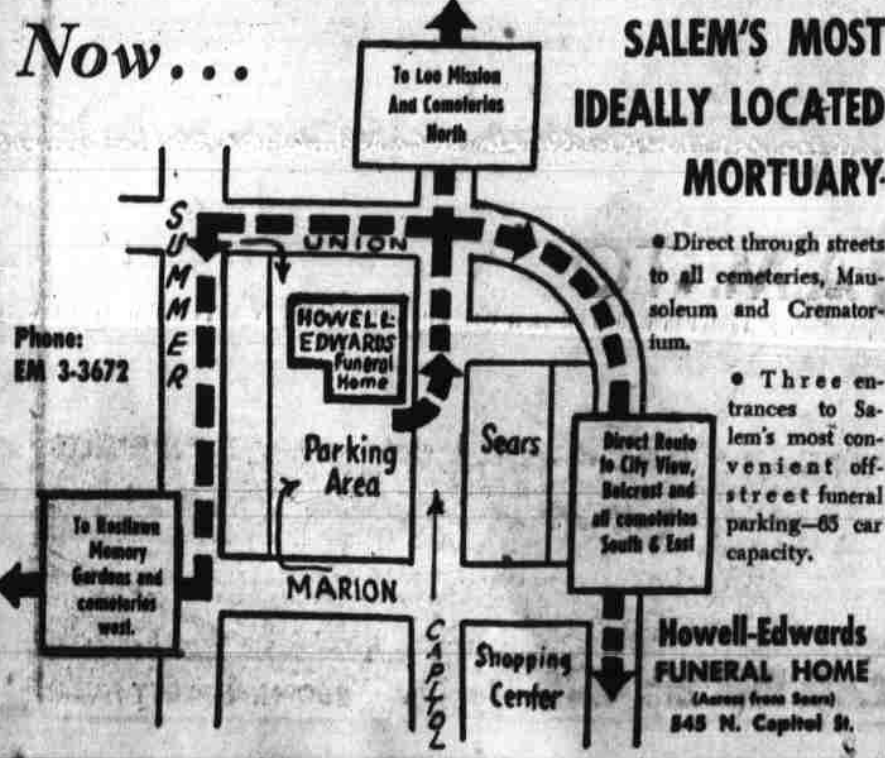
