

Senators Climax Pre-Season Games at Redding Today, Arrive Monday for Final Drills

 Convinced he has the makings of a solid winner for play in the Northwest League, boss Bill Brenner of the Salem Senators leads his crew into Redding, Calif., today for the final game of the Senators' "Grapefruit League" schedule.

Worked in booked for Waters Field Monday, and final night games are slated for Tuesday and Wednesday. The Senators open league play here Thursday night with the defending NWL champion Yakima Bears.

Don Masterson, former Senators catcher, leads the Redding team, that is to play Salem today, and has a full squad of former professionals who now live in the Redding area.

Coming north with the Salem team are catchers Harvey Koepf and Don Haggie, pitchers Brenner, Vern Kludtshofer, Willie Neal, Dean Sledge, Leo Franklin and Lee Walker, infielders Karl Knick, Ray Steele, Bob Campbell and Gene Larson, and outfielders Ted Rhodes, Erv Kaerner and Bob Durito.

Walker, a hard-throwing right-handed pitcher who was signed for a bonus by Seattle, is to join the Senators at Redding today. Kola, another hard-throwing youngster snatched from the

knuckle-balling skipper of the Waters Field forces has not yet officially named the starting pitcher for the Thursday opener with the Senators. But it likely will be veteran Kludtshofer, who won 18 games with Tri-City last season.

During their training period at Wasco, which was blessed with warm, sunny weather and hope of hard work, the Senators won 6 exhibition outings and lost 1.

The manager, who is making his debut with the Senators this season after numerous campaigns in the old Western International, and with the Seattle club last year, feels that the club will have sufficient balance, good pitching and defense.

"We'll know just how good we are, or aren't, when we see the other clubs," he adds, "but I like this club and believe it will win. If not, I'll make changes." Meanwhile, a number of special welcoming occasions await the arrival of the team. On Monday night the Knights of Columbus will hold their annual session in the K.C. Hall, one that opens with a private get-together at six o'clock and then open its doors to the public at 7:30. The Salem Breakfast Club's Wednesday night Smorgasbord dinner meeting at the Senator Hotel will be devoted to the Senators, and on Thursday noon, also at the Senator, a special open-to-the-public "Welcome Home" luncheon is to be held.

PORTLAND, April 20 (Special)—Coach Johnny Lewis' Willamette Bearcats preserved their undefeated status atop Northwest Conference baseball here Saturday afternoon by sweeping both ends of a double-header from Lewis and Clark.

Scores of 6-2 and 4-1 give the Bearcats a 4-0 conference record. Singles by Gary Burdge and Tom Moore, behind a walk and a hit batsman, got the Bearcats off to a 2-0 lead in the first game and they were never headed.

The Cats upped their lead to 5-0 with another burst in the fifth with singles by Howie Speer and Burdge and Vic Backlund's double each chasing home a run.

The Pioneers got on the scoreboard in the sixth as Joe Johnson's double plated George Adams, who had walked. Each team added an unearned run in the eighth.

Wild Sixth Inning
 A wild sixth inning in the second game, in which Willamette effectively used three misplayed batters, two of them going for singles, netted the Bearcats all four runs to break up a scoreless pitching duel between Jac Fowler and Ron Stempel.

Speer started it off by being hit by the pitcher for the third time in the two games and Backlund singled. Burdge followed with a bunt which went unfielded to lead the bases.

Celtics Slam Pro All-Stars

Cousy Brilliant In Easy Victory

G.I.L. COLISEUM, Corvallis, April 20 (Special)—The NBA champion Boston Celtics, loaded with individual brilliance and a fistful of two-legged reasons why they topped the professional basketball title, toyed with the Major League All-Stars in their exhibition clash here tonight, winning by an 118-108 score.

The Celtics got off to a flying start, leading 20-6 after six minutes, and then coasted most of the way. When their first unit of Bill Russell, Tom Heinsohn, Jim Loscutt, Bill Sharman and the great Bob Cousy were in action, and putting out, the Stars were badly outclassed.

Closed Gap Once
 The quarterly scores were 36-22, 60-47 and 96-77. The Stars got within six points, at 67-41 in the second period, but only because the Celts' second unit was off the bench.

Many of the 5,756 crowd bleached the classy Celtics purposely slacked off at times so that the Stars could stay in the game. Even so, the win was only the fourth, in six games now played between the barnstorming units.

The appreciative crowd oohed and ahhed time after time as the sharp passing and shooting athletes exhibited why they are pro greats. The fabulous Cousy repeatedly put forth with reasons why he's called "Mr. Basketball" and both Heinsohn and Russell weren't reluctant to show why they were the NBA's topmost rookies. Heinsohn gained "Rookie of the Year" honors in the league and tonight fired in 32 points with an amazing array of shots. Heinsohn had 18 points in the first quarter.

Loscutt Hits 18
 "Jungle Jim" Loscutt, former U of Oregon great was another big hit with the Celts and finished with 18 points. Russell had 20, and between the two of them they ruled the rebounds when they wanted it.

Defense was nil in the clash, as expected. But the individual ability of each of the cage cats made for a fine show, one that was highly appreciated by the crowd.

The 5,756 was the biggest gathering the touring troupe has yet drawn. Next stop for the team is Seattle on Sunday. Then it's Vancouver, Wash., Monday night.

Strong Oregon Cinderermen Beat Washington, 84-47

EUGENE, April 20 (Special)—The University of Oregon track team, aided by record performances by Steve Anderson, Doug Bingham and Ed Bingham, posted an 84-47 Northern Division track victory over Washington today.

Anderson's 100-yard dash time was 9.5 seconds. Bingham was clocked at 14.4 seconds for the 120-yard high hurdles and Bingham threw the javelin 236 feet, 9 1/2 inches for a meet record.

Washington also topped two meet records—Larry Pulford's 52 feet, 4 1/2 inches in the shot put event and the Husky relay team, anchored by Terry Tobacco, was clocked at 3 minutes, 18.4 seconds.

Oregon won all but four events. Washington winners were Tobacco in the 440, Pulford in the shot and discus and the Husky relay team.

The other double winner of the meet was Anderson. He added the 220-yard dash to his 100-yard victory. Oregon's Jim Grelle led a sweep in the mile. Martin Pedigo led another Oregon one-two-three in the broad jump; Robbie Mark Robinson won the two mile; Jim Bailey the 800; Jack Burg and Sam Whitney tied in the pole vault; Ken Grant won the high jump and Jack Morris took the low hurdle.
