BPA Opens Bids for Work At Chemawa

Bonneville Power Administration Saturday announced opening of bids for additions to Chemawa substation, 11 miles north of Salem.

Apparent low bid of \$50,114 was submitted by Olson Electric Co., Vancouver, Wash.

Expansion consists of steel towers for terminating the newly constructed 230,000 volt transmission line from Oregon City. Installation of disconnect switches and oil circuit breakers are required for system protection.

Addition of a second 230,000 volt source of supply will strengthen the service to BPA's transmission grid serving the middle Willamette valley area.

Other bidders include L. H. Morris Electric Company, Eugene, \$53,984; L. B. Read, Portland, \$53,711; The Brandon Co., Vancouver, Wash., \$53,736; Chas. R. Schmiedekamp Co., Portland, \$53,935; Mann Construction Co., Redmond, \$53,923; and MacSharp & Michaels Construction Co., Beaverton, \$53,978.
