Italian Boy to Get Operation

BALTIMORE, Dec. 31 (AP)—Although they know the chances are slim, eye surgeons at Johns Hopkins hospital decided today to operate in a forlorn attempt to give a GI-befriended Italian boy a New Year's present—his sight.

The eight-year-old boy, Gianfranco Cabbia, was blinded by the kick of a German cavalryman's horse Sept. 18, 1944. The GIs in Italy found him months later and made him their friend. Soldiers of three divisions chipped in money to bring him to Hopkins for a chance to see. He arrived in Baltimore last Friday.

Dr. Alan C. Woods, head of the Wilmer eye institute at Hopkins, said he and Dr. J. S. Guyton had examined the boy.

"We believe," he said, "he has some light perception in his one remaining eye. An operation has been decided upon, but it is extremely doubtful that it will be successful in restoring much vision."

However, he emphasized, they feel that even the small chance of giving sight back to Gianfranco is worth taking.

Bates to Open Surveying Office

David F. Bates, formerly of the county surveyor's office in Salem, has received his discharge from the army air forces, Lowry Field, Denver, and will open his own business in Salem. Bates has been working on the construction of the atomic bomb at the Paso, Wash., plant for the past three years.

Bates is opening his own land surveying office at 477 Court st. and plans to cover all types of survey work.

Churchill Awarded Order of Merit on King's Honor List

LONDON, Dec. 31 (AP)—Winston Churchill, who last July declined the order of the garter, highest British decoration of chivalry, was awarded the order of merit today in King George VI's New Year honor list.

The order of merit is a distinction limited to 24 holders. Five military leaders were made viscounts by the monarch in recognition of their achievements during the war, and three scientists who aided in the development of atomic energy also were honored.

The military men who were named viscounts included: Field Marshal Sir Bernard L. Montgomery, who was field commander of the 21st army group in Europe; Field Marshal Lord Alan Brooke, chief of the imperial staff; Field Marshal Sir Harold R. L. G. Alexander, former supreme allied commander in the Mediterranean theater.

Halsey to Be Best Man at Wedding

SANTA MONICA, Calif., Dec. 31 (AP)—Adm. William F. Halsey, jr., will be best man at the wedding later this week of Screen Actress Myrna Loy and Commodore Gene Markey, the former movie producer said today after he and Miss Loy obtained a marriage license here.

Markey, who served on Halsey's staff when the latter was commander of the Third fleet in the southwest Pacific, said the ceremony would take place probably Wednesday or Thursday in the San Diego, Calif., navy base chapel.

Paper Strike No Nearer End

SEATTLE, Dec. 31 (AP)—The strike committee of the typographical union local (AFL) did not appear today at a meeting called by Mayor William F. Devin in a renewed effort to settle the wage dispute which shut down Seattle's three daily newspapers Nov. 18.

The mayor asked publishers and committee members to confer in his office. The strikers, asking a daily wage boost of \$2.95, yesterday turned down a return-to-work proposal from the publishers. The mayor's office said the offer was for an increase of \$2.25 for day work and \$2.50 for night work.

The mayor's office reported late tonight the strike committee had called to explain that it had not

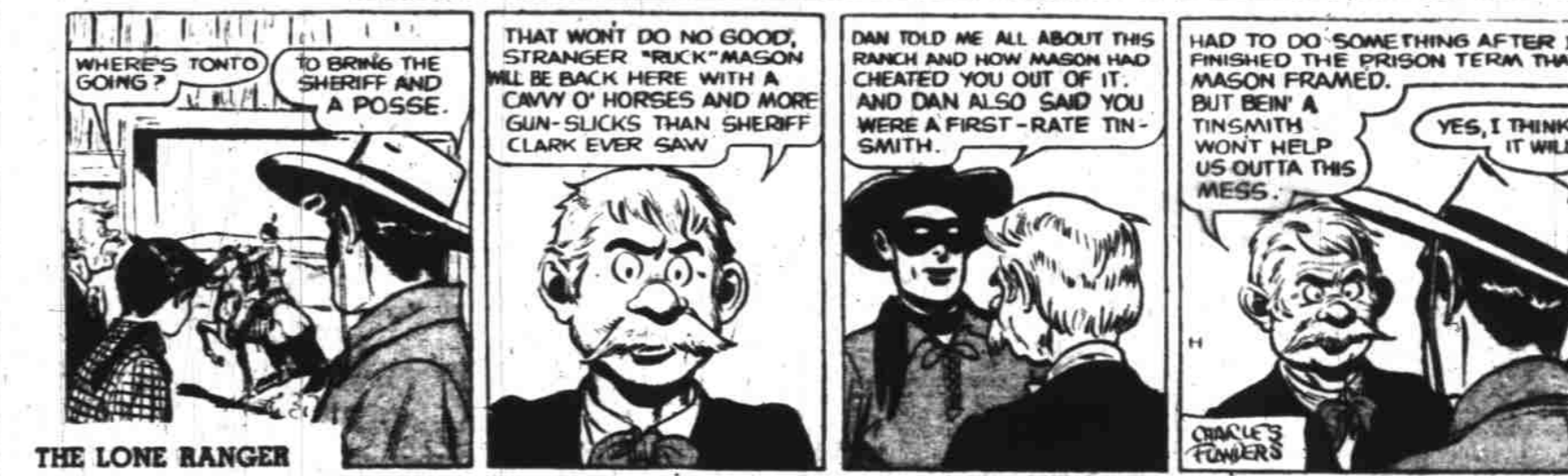
