

'Oilers' and 'Vitamins' Tie In Icy 'Snow Bowl' Grid Tilt

ST. PAUL, Minn., Jan. 1—(AP)—In snow a foot deep and with the pigskin stuck in the snow-drifts several times during play, St. Paul's first annual gridiron classic—the Snow Bowl—ended in a scoreless tie today. The temperature stood near zero.

They weren't highly polished college teams but the several thousand spectators who stood in some drifts three feet deep at the Highland stadium cheered just as vociferously.

The game was between the Golden Oilers, sponsored by a filling station proprietor, and the Purple Vitamins, backed by

a druggist. Players were high school gridirers assembled from the neighborhood.

The gridiron stalwarts donned heavy mittens to keep their hands from freezing and wore high boots. In between halves, they drank hot coffee around a stove installed to keep them warm.

The queen of the Snow Bowl, Barbara Desmond, was brought to the stadium in a bobbed drawn by a Shetland pony.

Red ink and heavy paper cardboard were used for the gridiron markings, and the field was marked off with 30 gallons of red ink.

Sleepy Father Mistakes Dead Soldier for Son

STREATOR, Ill., Jan. 1—(AP)—A sorrowful family attended an inquest today for an accident victim, identified by the father as his soldier son, but it suddenly became a happy New Year's day for them.

Aroused from sleep early this morning, Edward Huber, 52, a meat cutter, went to the county morgue and identified the body of a young man killed in a taxi-cab accident as his son, Alfred, 31, who recently returned from the Pacific.

At the inquest, a police sergeant testified as to Huber's identification. The coroner issued a burial certificate in the name of Alfred Huber.

Then, in walked Alfred Huber, who had just returned from an overnight trip out of town, and demanded: "What's going on here?"

His mother fainted. His sisters burst into hysterics. His brothers pumped his hand in joy. His father blinked and said:

"Son, I couldn't swoon that was you. I was pretty sleepy about 6 a.m."

The body was identified later as Walter Springman, 23, of Alton, Ill., another discharged soldier.

Willys Plans New Small Car

TOLEDO, O., Jan. 1—(AP)—Charles E. Sorensen, president of Willys-Overland Motors, Inc., announced today his company has designed, engineered, developed and thoroughly proved a completely new, low-cost small passenger car, embodying features and basic improvements never before offered in a car in this class.

The statement was the first announcement of the company's postwar production program, which already has the jeep in production.

Sorensen said the company will produce "a new and original vehicle closely related to the familiar station wagon, incorporating new utilitarian concepts and features of design and construction never before offered in a vehicle of this type. A new light truck in four conventional body types on the same chassis and a large commercial chassis of heavier load capacity will follow."
