Donald Douris, recently returned from the south Pacific, where he was a member of the enlisted personnel of a B-29 service group medical section, is back in his office at the First Presbyterian church after an absence of 3 1/2 years. He will continue in his capacity as youth director at the church and will specialize in directing activities for the church's teen-age groups.

A teller at the United States National bank in Salem for a number of years, Douris was formerly active in community and civic affairs of the city. In 1939 he attended the World Christian Youth conference held in Amsterdam, Holland, and was a member of one of the last groups of American tourists to go through Germany before the outbreak of the war. While at Amsterdam, he also attended the second World YMCA conference as a delegate of the Northwest YMCA.

A charter member of the Salem Junior Chamber of Commerce, an active member of the local YMCA and active in youth leadership of church young people throughout the state, he was chosen junior first citizen of Salem in 1939, was awarded the Silver Beaver Boy Scout award in 1942, and is a holder of the Scoutmaster's Key.

Douris will direct the activities of Boy Scout troop 8 at the church and is inviting parents of boys between the ages of nine and 15 to get in touch with him or the church office concerning Boy Scout or Cubbing activities for their sons. Douris will enter Willamette university in the March term and will do part-time work at the church while attending school.
