Torgeson Sold To Boston Nats

SEATTLE, Jan. 5. —(AP)—Earl Torgeson, bespectacled rookie first baseman who is still a private in the U. S. army in Germany, was sold conditionally by Seattle of the Pacific Coast Baseball league to the Boston Braves of the National league for what eventually may total "more than \$100,000" in cash and four players, it was announced tonight.

Vice President Roscoe "Torchy" Torgerson said the Braves obtained Torgeson for 1947 delivery in exchange for a large but undisclosed amount of cash, one player outright and three on option, with the four to report to Seattle this season.

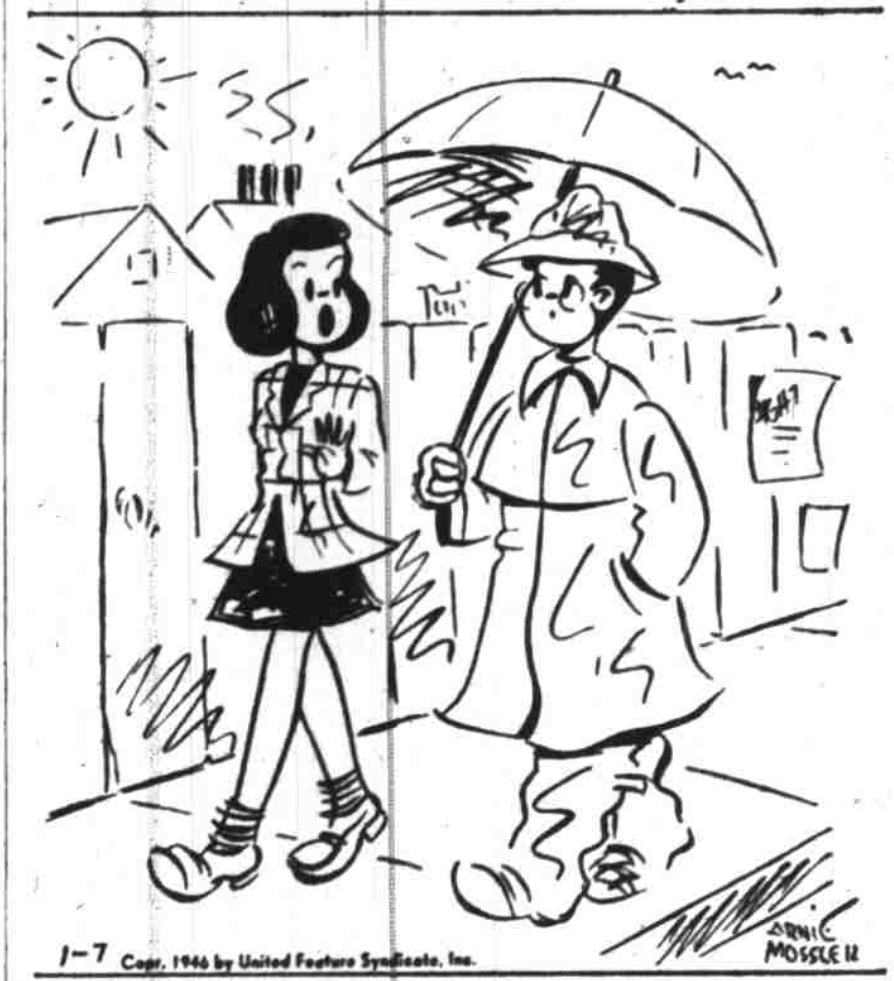
