Jellied Gas To Be Used in Forest Work

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7.—(AP)—The chemical warfare service and the forest service will test war-developed explosives in Oregon timberland to remove slash and snags, Rep. Ellsworth (R-Ore.) has been advised.

U. S. Forest Service Chief Lyle F. Watts told Ellsworth that jellied gasoline, effective in uncrotting strong Japanese defenses and in bombing cities, would be used.

Two officers from the chemical warfare service have been assigned to work with our personnel in Oregon," Watts wrote Ellsworth. "We expect that tests will be completed this month."

Use of a powerful explosive called "demolition block M-3," which has a greater shocking power than TNT and is of plastic consistency in summer weather, has been discussed by forestry and army officials, Watts said. At 34 cents a pound, however, it may be too costly for forest service use, he reported.

Rye Pulls Up Other Grains

CHICAGO, Jan. 7.—(AP)—The usually nervous rye futures prices kept most of the other grains on the move today.

Although trading again was in moderate quantities, rye skipped around over its customary fairly broad range in response to light touches either way and pulled wheat and oats along.

Wheat closed 1/4 higher to 1/2 lower than the previous finish, May \$1.80 1/2; corn unchanged at \$1.18 1/2; soybeans, 1/2 to 1/4 lower, May \$1.73 1/2; barley unchanged to 1/4 higher, May \$1.21 1/2.

Big Output at Fair Prices Vital Problem

CORVALLIS, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Abundant production at reasonable prices, compared with scarcity production at high prices, again is becoming a vital problem to Oregon farmers, state AAA Chairman Robert M. Taylor said today.

He told the convention of county AAA committeemen that the lower production, high-price system was "selfish" and led to trouble. Except on supply purchases, support prices will be more important to farmers than ceiling prices, Taylor stated.

To balance production, the entire field of parity prices and income should be reviewed, he said. Sub-committee meetings and procedures in soil conservation, production and marketing will occupy most of the three-day session, which opened today with about 100 committeemen present. G. F. Geissler, western regional field director, Washington, D. C., is here.

Select Group In Comeback

NEW YORK, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Rais and specialties led a selective recovery shift in today's stock market although many leaders were unable to shake off minus signs.

The substantially improved financial position of most roads attracted buyers who foresaw the transportation section pacing a likely spring rise. Idle cash, however, continued to shun numerous pivots which are in the shadow of actual and threatened strikes. Belief the market was in a healthier technical shape inspired some bids. The outlook for dividends and earnings also was a factor.

Gains of fractions to 2 points predominated at the close. There were a few wider swings. Transfers totaled 1,230,000 shares compared with 1,070,000 Friday.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up .1 of a point at 75. Of 940 issues appearing, 455 advanced, 300 declined and 185 were unchanged.
