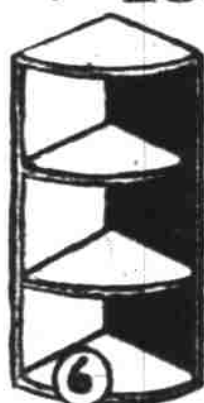

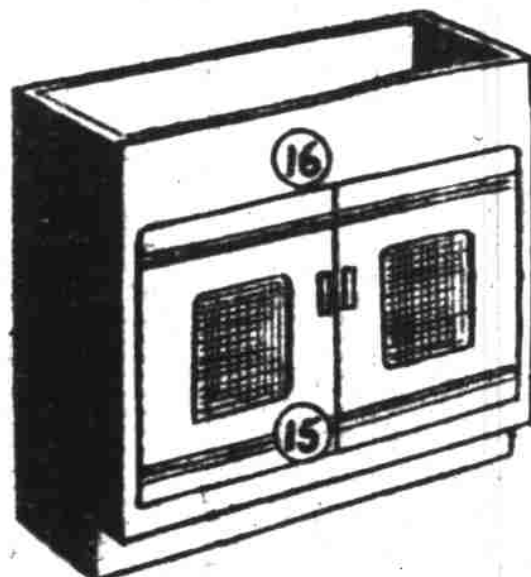

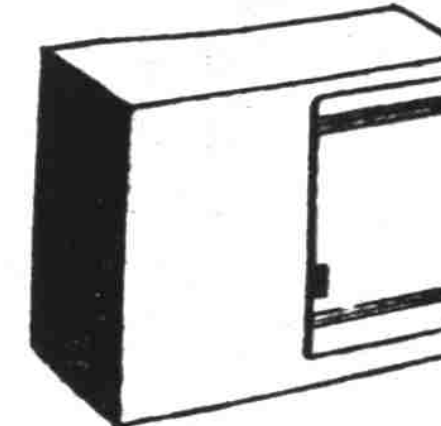


Sink Cabinet

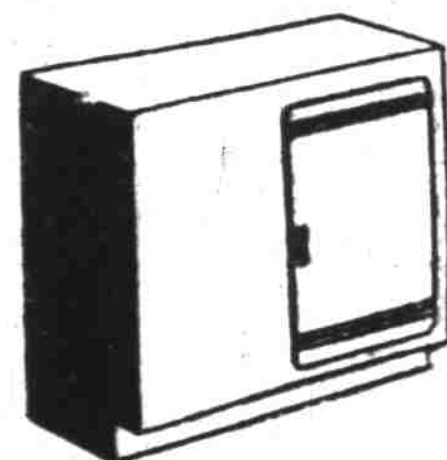
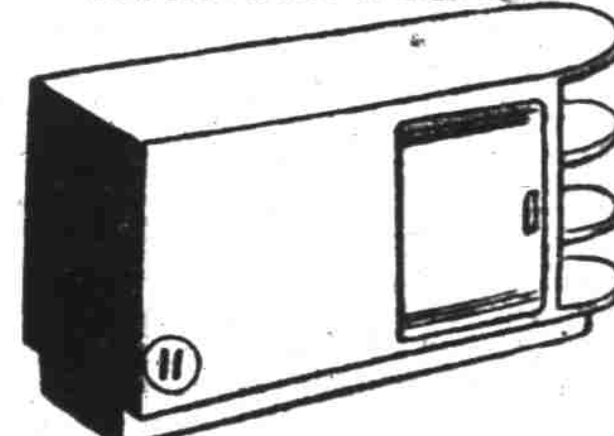
Kitchen Bar

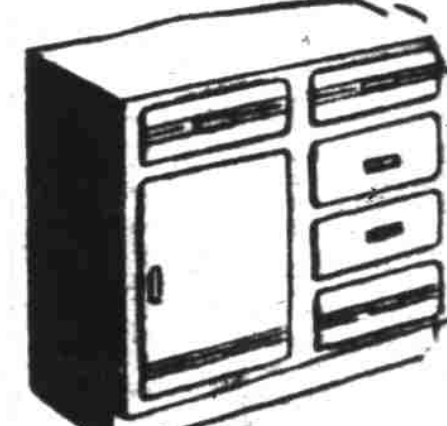
Two-Door Cabinet
