## Gardening Today

January is the last month when dormant spraying can be sure. Because plants are at their lowest point of activity at this time stronger materials can be used and more effective work can be done.



The flowering peach trees particularly needs spraying this time, especially if the December spray was missed because of the wet weather. A Bordeaux spray, dormant strength, should be put on the peaches for leaf curl. It is very important to get thorough coverage. Every bud on the tree should be covered. If the spray can remain on for at least six to eight hours without being rained off, one spray will be sufficient. Should rain fall within the first few hours after the spraying, it may be necessary to repeat in a few days. A 6-6-50 solution is recommended.

A dormant lime-sulphur spray for lilacs is also beneficial this month. This will control to a large extent the moss which disfigures the lilacs. Commercial concentrated lime-sulphur, which is diluted one part to nine parts of water, is one of the best all-around sprays to use now, since it is effective not only against moss and scale but against some diseases.

Questions and answers: Mrs. M. C. A. asks if there are

some shrubs which flower in the winter here. She is from Los Angeles and has come north to make her home. Reports she likes it here but would like something that blooms during the winter. She is interested in bouquets, she says.

Ans.: Of course, we cannot give her the shrubs which bloom at this time of the year in Los Angeles, but we don't do so badly for winter bouquet material. She will learn soon, I am sure, that the wealth of berried shrubs which thrive here give good bouquet material. Also we have the yellow flowering jasmine which is now in bloom and the laurustinus which blooms all winter long. There are some of the heathers which all bloom now. Too, there are the Chimanthus praecox and rhododendron mucronulatum and the camellia sasanqua.

Shrubs such as golden privet or the variegated junipers also add variety to the winter bouquets.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 3.3 of a point at 77.8, but for the week retained a net gain of 2.9 points, widest spread since the week concluded Sept. 9, 1939.

### New Vet Loans Due in March

PORTLAND, Jan. 12.—(AP) Banks probably will start making loans to veterans under the improved, amended GI bill of rights in March, the Oregon Bankers' association committee on veterans' affairs said yesterday.

Robert B. Hurd, committee chairman, predicted a "landslide of loan business" as soon as new forms and regulations are ready for use. He advised ex-servicemen who want to buy homes, farms or businesses to wait for the new act, which has more liberal terms and makes transactions simpler. Hurd mailed information on the amended bill to Oregon bankers today.
