

High School Rules Body Makes Slight Changes In Prep Football Regulations

CHICAGO, Jan. 12. (AP)—The national federation of high school athletic associations today revised a long standing football rule on a fumble or incomplete lateral pass that goes out of bounds. The new rule adopted awards possession of the ball to the offensive team. Formerly it went to the team which last touched the ball.

Other rule changes by the federation, which includes prep associations from 43 states, were: Reducing the 15-yard penalty for illegal fair catch signal to five yards.

Permit substitutions at any time the ball is dead, but only two new players may come into the game while time is running. Permit linesmen any desired stance as long as their hands are one foot from the scrimmage line.

The federation voted to sanction summer high school baseball, golf and tennis, and approved an agreement by professional baseball clubs to sign prep athletes only after graduation or a year after they leave school.
