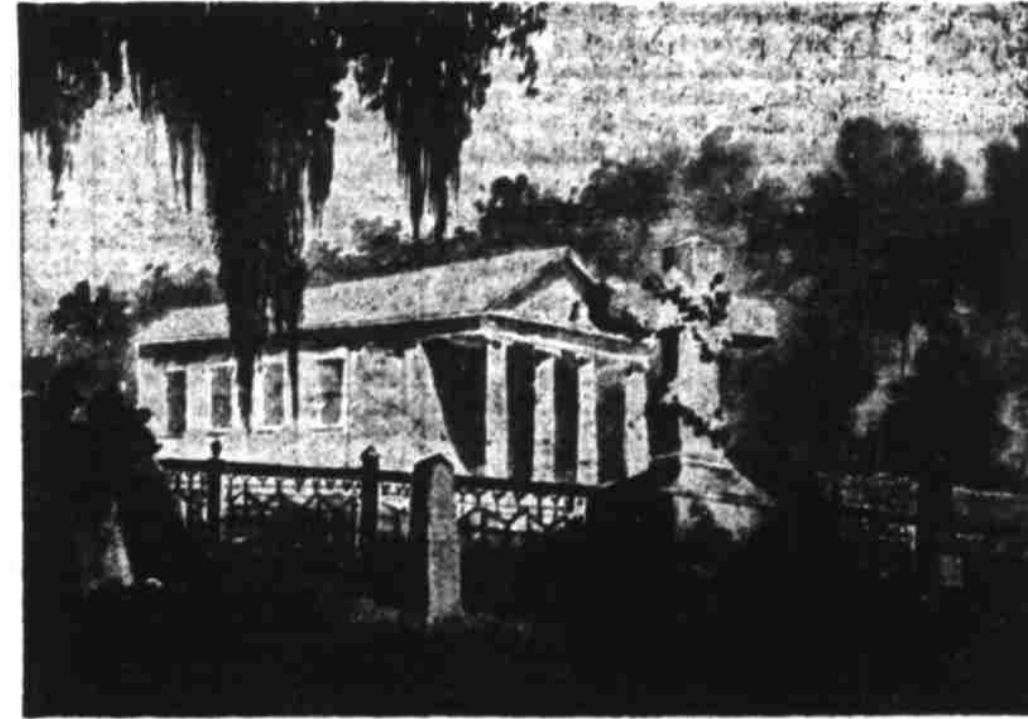
### Conference to Be Held in Salem
