Power Report Is Presented At Silverton

SILVERTON, Feb. 12 (Special) - George Joseph of Portland presided as chairman at the hydro-electric commission hearing in the Eugene Field building Monday night.

Approximately 100 came to hear preliminary report given by D. J. McLellan of the state engineers' office, and to hear arguments for and against the proposed people's public utilities district in Marion county. The area to be served includes 842 miles, with an
