

May Rye Wins Support, Rises 5-Cent Limit

CHICAGO, Feb. 13 (AP)—May rye acquired a sudden burst of support near the close of futures trading today and the price shot up the 5-cent daily limit advance within a few minutes.

The rally followed a report from Washington that the senate agriculture committee headed by Senator Elmer Thomas (D-Okl.) had called for reconsideration of rye price ceilings.

In a report presented to the entire senate, the committee requested that the use of commodity credit corporation funds "in competition with private enterprise" be discontinued and that operations of the grain branch be made public.

Wheat, corn and barley closed unchanged at ceiling prices of \$1.80 1/2, \$1.18 1/2 and \$1.22 1/2. Oats were unchanged to 1/4 cent higher than Monday's close, May 81-cent ceiling; rye unchanged to 5 cents up, May \$2.12 1/2-1/4.

Industrials Off In Continued Market Slump

NEW YORK, Feb. 13 (AP)—Steels, motors, aviation, rails and most industrials in today's stock market fell fractions to 3 points and more in a continuation of the downward trend which has persisted for nearly two weeks.

Liquors were among the few spots of resistance because of a last-minute rally. National distillers, Schenley and Distillers Corp., advanced.

American Telephone, Western Union "A," U.S. Rubber, Phelps Dodge, Boeing, Public Service N. J. and American Radiator managed to retain slight gains.

Failure of the administration to announce its long-awaited new wage-price policy helped create pessimism among patrons regarding the widespread labor walk-outs.

General Motors and Chrysler were down from the start coincident with the CIO-United Auto Workers' refusal to accept GM's offer of an 18 1/2 cents an hour wage boost.

Sales totaled 1,680,000 shares against 1,440,000 Monday. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was down 9 of a point to 77.1—more than 3 points below the 15-year high of 80.4 hit Feb. 2, 1910.



Street-Lighting Adviser Named
