

### May Rye Slips 3 1/2 Cents After Steady Trend

CHICAGO, Feb. 27 (AP)—After holding at steady to firm prices most of the day, May rye slipped about 3 1/2 cents a bushel in the final minutes of trading today, finishing the session with an average loss of around 2 cents a bushel.

Despite the sixth consecutive nickel limit setback for the grain at Winnipeg, brokers bid the price around 1 1/2 cents upward at the opening and held frac-

tional advances most of the time against moderate liquidation which uncovered some additional stop loss selling.

Buyers of rye hesitate to make purchases due to the fact that the time is drawing near when the ceiling of \$1.44 1/2 cents will be imposed on the May delivery unless the OPA revises its order, said James E. Bennett and Company.

Wheat, corn and barley finished again at ceilings of \$1.80 1/2, \$1.18 1/2 and \$1.22 1/2. Oats were unchanged to 1/4 cent higher than yesterday's close. May 81-cent ceiling, and rye was unchanged to 2 1/4 off, May \$2.14 1/2-3/4.

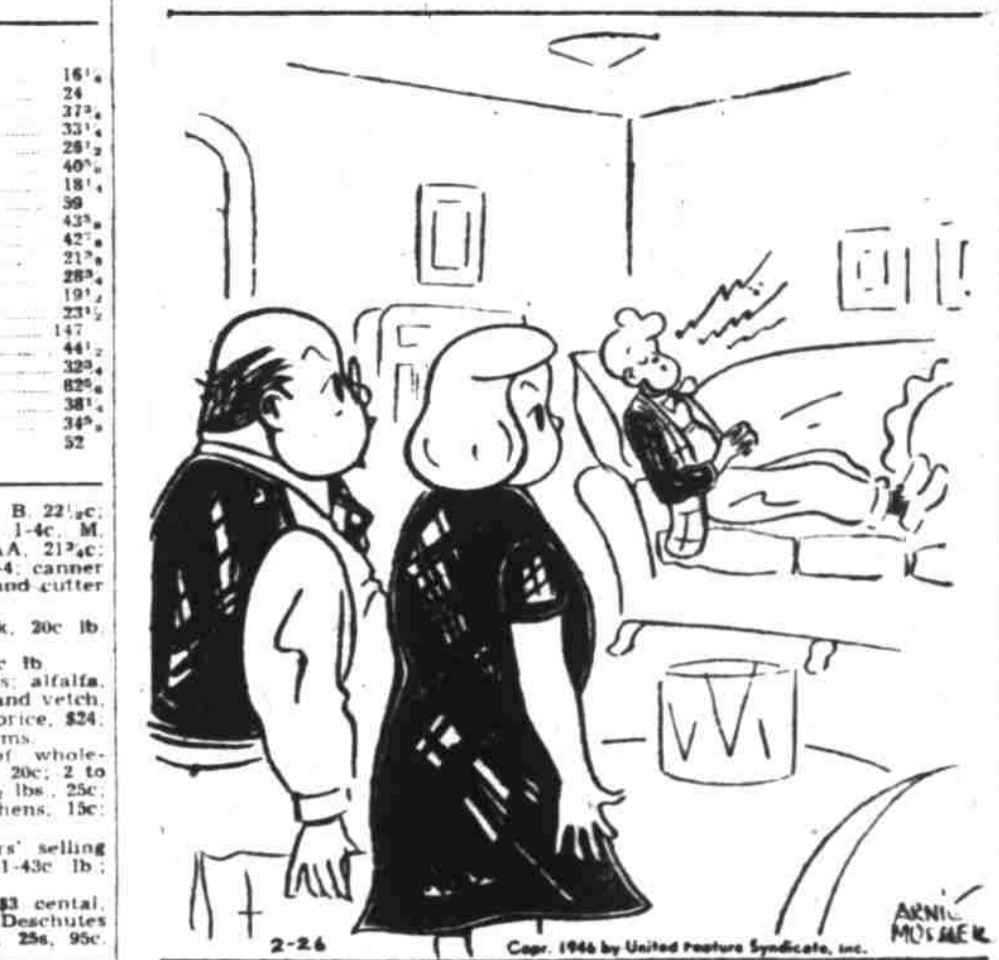

### Stock Market Begins Rise

NEW YORK, Feb. 27 (AP)—A number of leading stocks gained 1 to more than 4 points today as the market snapped back from the downturns of the past two sessions.

Closing prices of many leaders were at the day's best levels. Transfer of 1,400,000 shares were sharply down from Tuesday's 2,650,000.

Buying by customers with idle funds resulting from recent profit casing was credited by brokers with providing a lift, along with belief the list was in line for a comeback following sharp breaks earlier this week. Dividend increases spurred some issues.

The Associated Press 60-stock average advanced 1.5 points, to 73.7, against a total decline of 3.7 points in the previous two sessions.

- A. SPEED: If you want to know your tax quickly, without waiting for the collector's notice. (You figure it out on the short form.)
B. KIND OF INCOME: If you received more than \$100 from dividends, interest or wages not subject to withholding, or if you received any income from any source other than wages, dividends and interest. (Then you MUST use form 1040.)
C. BUSINESS EXPENSES: If you have rental expenses or losses from sale or exchange of property to deduct in computing total income. (These can't be listed on withholding receipt.)

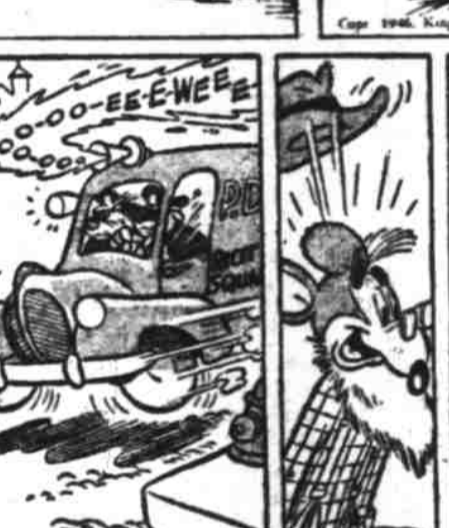
