

DIXON BACK FROM LUMBER MEETING HELD AT CHICAGO

Discussion of plans for trade extension and promotion, perfecting plans for closer co-operation between the manufacturer, wholesaler and retailer, looking to a wider distribution of lumber products and working out plans for an intensified selling campaign, occupied most of the time at a meeting of the National Lumber Manufacturers' association in Chicago November 6, 7, and 8, according to A. C. Dixon, general manager of the Booth Kelly Lumber company, who is president of the national group. Mr. Dixon returned to Eugene Monday and after a brief trip to Portland came home Thursday night. He had been gone for more than three weeks.

Mr. Dixon was not pessimistic in his tone in discussing conditions in the lumber market and business conditions in general. There is a great deal of unemployment throughout the east, he said, but measures are being taken everywhere to alleviate as far as possible distress and suffering caused by the depression in business.

The executive board of the National Lumber Manufacturers' association called upon Rufus Dawes, an outstanding financier of Chicago and president of the "Century of Progress," which is the name of the big world exposition to be held in that city in 1933. The project will cost \$80,000,000, according to estimates, and already construction on different buildings has been started. It is planned to carry the project through to completion, said Mr. Dixon. The executive board presented plans and blue prints looking toward the use of lumber in the construction of the large number of buildings and Mr. Dawes assured the members that a major of the buildings will be of that type.

On November 11 a special committee from the lumbermen's association, of which Mr. Dixon was chairman, went to Washington, D. C., and called upon President Hoover, Attorney-General Mitchell, his assistant, John Lord O'Brien, Secretary of Agriculture Hyde, Chief Forester Major Stuart, Secretary Mellon, Secretary of Commerce Lamont, and Col. Arthur Woods, whom the president has appointed head of the group to look into the unemployment situation.

In these conferences the lumbermen attempted to bring about a better understanding of the lumber business, and a discussion of the importance of Russian lumber is believed to have been productive of results.

Among other things discussed was the lumbermen's part in the unemployment problem. Mr. Dixon, and the matter of President Hoover's proposed timber conservation board was talked of. This board is soon to be appointed. The personnel is to be made up of men who are retired or have a great deal of time which they can devote to the work. The purpose of the board will be to ascertain how much timber there is in the United States and how long it will last. The work of the board will be very exhaustive, said Mr. Dixon.

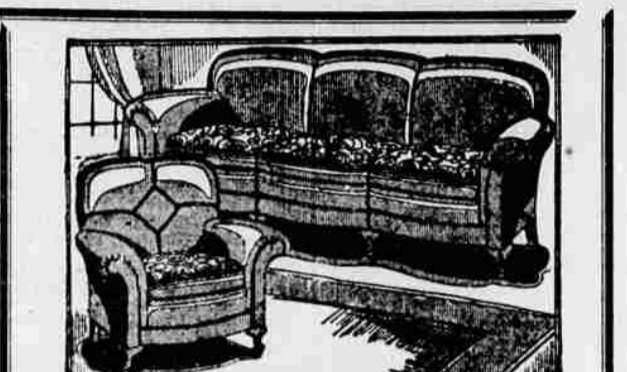
