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Cottage Grove May Be Site of Hotel

Cottage Grove was one jump ahead of Gardiner, Empire, and Scottsbluff Saturday night in the competition for the location of a new hotel. The

hotel. The south Lane town was advanced Saturday by two Eugene women, giving it thus for a plurality in the vote.

Mr. J. G. Crockett told the Register-Glad that the Lockwood hotel was located on Main street, Cottage Grove, just below the present site of the depot. It was at one time occupied by her father, W. H. Channing, she said, and she lived there until she was eight years of age. The old building was torn down a number of years ago, she said. The Spry brick building now occupies the site.

Mrs. W. H. McKenzle, 1539 Lawrence street, Eugene, was the other woman who urged Cottage Grove as the location of the hotel. Mrs. McKenzle stated that she did not remember the street.

A picture of the old Lockwood hotel, taken from the McClanahan collection of old-time photos, was printed in the Register-Glad of last week. The picture shows the hotel, but it could not be ascertained from the pages of the paper were asked to ask.
