

EUGENE GLEEMEN TO GIVE PROGRAM AT PORTLAND MEET

Sixty-five members of the Eugene Gleemen, with their director, John Stark Evans, and their accompanist, Miss Cora Moore, go to Portland Sunday to put on a half-hour program for the opening of the northwest Rotary convention there Sunday evening.

"This is the most important undertaking the Gleemen have done. There will be 4000 delegates at the Rotary convention and Eugene will get a great deal of publicity," Dr. Charles E. Hunt, president of the Gleemen, said.

The program for the Sunday night event opens at the city auditorium in Portland at 7:45 o'clock. Mr. Evans will give a 20-minute organ recital after which the Gleemen will go on for a half hour. Bishop Lowe and Mayor Baker of Portland are on the program for talks. The entire program will be broadcast. Following is the Gleemen program: "Prayer of Thanksgiving," arranged by Krenser; "Where'er you Walk," Handel; "Miserere," Meyer-Hellman; incidental solo to be sung by Loren Davidson; "The River," arranged by Evans; "Herschel Scott, baritone, to sing incidental solo; "Red Man's Death Chant," Bliss; "Let's Symposium," Lamorch; numbers by Gleemen quartet, "A Song of Winter," Hawley; "O Miss Hannah," Deppen; "Castilla," a ballad of Spain, Protheros, Gleemen.

The Gleemen will leave Eugene at 1 o'clock Sunday afternoon by automobile. They will have dinner at 6:30 o'clock at the Congress hotel in Portland, Sunday evening, going from there to the auditorium for their program.

Garden Talks to Be Given Over KORE

King of Siam and His Consort in U. S. Home

PURCHASE, N. Y., April 23.—(AP)—King Prajadhipok, one of two remaining absolute monarchs in the world, and his consort, the beautiful Queen Rambal-barni, settled down today in what will be their home during most of their visit to this country.

The royal couple planned to spend a day of absolute quiet and the king has indicated there will be no functions in his honor until he has made his official visit to President Hoover at the White House next week.

Ogby Hall, the 75-room mansion of Mrs. William Reid, in which the king and queen are staying, was a curiosity spot. Special details of United States secret service men surrounded the great gray manor to keep sightseers away and insure absolute seclusion for their majesties.

King Prajadhipok, ruler of 11,500,000 subjects in Siam, was visibly tired from the journey nearly half way

around the world. He spent a restful night in this quiet, suburban town.

The king has been weakened by a recurrence of malaria and suffered an attack of bronchitis on his trip across the United States.

Prajadhipok—bearer of the titles "descendant of the great God Buddha, supreme arbiter of the ebb and flow of tides, brother of the moon, half brother of the sun, and possessor of the four and twenty umbrellas"—has come to this country for an operation for a cataract on his left eye, which is said to have been caused by his constant cowering of motion pictures. It is expected he will grant an audience to Dr. John M. Wheeler, who is to perform the operation the latter part of this week.

The king and queen, who is known as "the glorious lady of God," will remain incognito as Prince and Princess Sukhodaya, until Tuesday when they will leave for the official visit to Washington.

LAWRENCE CAREER STORY

In the R. A. F. forbids him to give interviews for publication. Nevertheless, there was no ban on "conversations."

"You will recognize me easily," he wrote when he finally agreed to meet me. "The R. A. F. wear a dull grey-blue-green uniform like soldiers, but more scruffy. In this I am an inconspicuous and unimpressive figure about five and a half feet high, with a face the color of a boiled lobster."

Meeting Unconventional
Actually, when he met me, grinning broadly, at the top of the steps from which the pillars fathers embarked in the Mayflower 300 years ago, he wore over his "scruffy" uniform a black rubber coat.

"I'm Shaw," he said simply, and under his guidance we descended the steps to water level and entered his American speed boat for the trip across the sound.

"She's the nicest thing in these waters," he said proudly. "The late Henry Bagnard brought her back from the makers, Purdy of Port Washington, Long Island. She was bought by Colin Cooper of London, and given to

me. We English can't make anything that can touch her."

So he dashed across the sound at 40 miles an hour—and I understood the reason for the rubber coat. We landed, drenched, at Mount Batten, the royal air force station. And there he described to me the philosophy that enabled him to live happily on 80 cents a day, his soldier's pay.

Ambition Evil
Ambition, first of all, seems to him "the cause of most of mankind's evils." This applies both to personal ambition and the ambition of nations—commercial rivalry, the spirit of aggression. If the Egyptians had ambition, he says, they could probably rid their land of British occupational forces in a decade. If Mussolini had not inspired the Italians with ambition, he adds, Italy probably would revert to its pre-war status as a nation in a decade. Ten years, in his opinion, is sufficient time in which to make or break a nation—or a man.

Yet Aircraftman Shaw has two small ambitions, as I said.

"I want," he told me, "to experience the thrill of dropping from a great height in a parachute. I imagine the feeling must be remarkable. I want to experience that. You must have the decision which is bound to occur on the verge of jumping. And I don't care if the parachute fails to open, either."

There spoke something of the fatalistic, perhaps.

The other desire is "to live to see the day when I can write for a living." Yet, stubbornly, he will not write if his product is sold by his name alone.

Back again to the theme of ambition—the reason "Shaw" is here in the air force, his hands grimy with motor oil, his face blackened by grit and grease, "Shaw," once counselor of kings and princes.

"I am far more contented than any man of my rank at Mount Batten," he said. "Most of these others want something. Some want riches. Some want women. Some want rank. I want nothing. I have had almost everything worth trying in life. I have had wealth. I have had power. I am sick and tired of it all. You must have had all this to know what it is."

Has No Friends
"I have no friends—only millions of acquaintances. I have no interest in women. To me, all food is alike except oysters and parsley. I don't like oysters. I'm not fond of parsley—tastes like a grave! In short, I've tried practically everything and had enough, so now I'm a perfectly contented human being, with no desires and no ambitions worth mentioning."

"I have four more years to serve," he said, "then I shall retire to my cottage. I intend to write, but I probably won't make much out of it. I shall make what I need by translating. All I want is three pounds (\$15) a week, which I have saved already."

One pound (\$5) additional, for little luxuries. It is far too much trouble to work for more."

Before becoming "Lawrence of Arabia," he was an archaeologist. He is an expert linguist, and his knowledge of Arabian dialects was responsible for much of his success in the desert during the war. But he scoffed at stories saying that he was many times "mistaken for an Arab."

SEAHRST PARK, Sussex, England, April 23.—(AP)—Air Vice-Marshal Felton Vesey Holt, commander of the air defenses of Great Britain, was killed today in an airplane collision.

His pilot, Flight Lieutenant Henry Moody, also was killed. The occupant of the other plane escaped injury.

Vice-Marshal Holt was one of the pioneers of the Royal air force and had received the distinguished service order for valor. He was promoted to his present post Jan. 1 and appointed "Air officer commanding the fighting area of air defense of Great Britain" April 7.

The planes crashed 1500 feet in the air about six miles from Tangmere airfield. When the airfield staff reached the wreckage both Holt and his pilot were dead.

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ADA GIRL IS FIRST BLUE RIBBON CHILD

Gertrude B. Jackson, a grade school girl of Ada, is the first child in Lane county to completely qualify for a Blue ribbon for proficiency in health habits, according to Beth Konkel, executive secretary of the Lane County Public Health association.

Her "score-card" with signatures of her doctor, dentist and teacher that she was qualified reached the health association office Thursday. To win the Blue ribbon she took physical examinations, went to a dentist

for inspection of her teeth, earned a passing grade in school, observed health rules, and was immunized for smallpox and diphtheria.
