Over Mapleton way there are many who have spent years and years in working and hoping for the building of the Sinuslaw highway. Among these hardworking boosters is Joe Morris Jr., who has lived in the Lane County for more than 32 years.

"Two always said it I die before that road's done, it's going to be fixed in my will so they will have to start on over the road just once before they bury me," announced Mr. Morris, known better among his many friends as Joe or Variety Joe.

Born in Yolo county, California, Jan. 28, 1861, Mr. Morris landed in the Sinuslaw March 23, 1879. His father, Joe Morris Sr., who passed away two years ago at the age of 93, came to the Sinuslaw in 1874.

The younger Morris farmed on the North Fork for several years. "They credit Benjamin Franklin with saying you had to stick to one job 10 years to make a success. I lacked five days of staying with the farm 10 years," Mr. Morris commented.

In 1907 he bought out Fred Bean at Mapleton and has been in the store business there since, his firm being Morris and Son general merchandise. They have had the same location for more than 24 years, putting up another building in later years. Today the Morris store is the headquarters for those who would come to Mapleton to know what's what and what's doing.

Morris, who is associated with his father in the merchandise business and who is postmaster at Mapleton, and a daughter, Mrs. Sylvia Wright, who lives in Long Beach, Cal. HONDURAN TROOPS TO BATTLE REBELS

CEIBA, Honduras, April 24.—(AP)—(via Radio of the S. S. Gatun to United Press)—Federal troops were mobilizing in the San Pedro Sula region today for a new offensive against the revolutionary forces which have harassed northern Honduras this week.

The revolutionists, said to have been repulsed in various clashes in the Cortes zone, were reported attempting to concentrate their forces but their position was not definitely known.

The insurgents have been scattering before the federal advances and hiding in the rough mountain country, the government officials said. The government troops are well armed with rifles, but many of the rebels have used machetes as their weapons.

The reputed rebel leader, General Gregorio Ferrera, was said to be friendly to Americans and there have been no reports of foreigners being molested.

Federal reinforcements of 250 men sailed from Ceiba last night for Puerto Cortes, en route to San Pedro Sula. They were on a United Fruit company ship. The entire nation is under martial law, which is rigidly enforced.

of effort between university and state college is concerned, is that it leaves them both separate units while attempting to take from both functions that really belong to each one. Thus it would take pure science from the university and commerce from the state college while leaving each institution a degree given unit. Obviously a university without a department of pure science would be a university in name only; and there is reason for believing that commerce courses at a state land grant college are authorized by the Morrill act.

"Obedience to such a recommendation would impair the usefulness of both institutions by robbing them of departments vital to their welfare."

Single Head Seen

"The state board of higher education is considering seriously the coordination of all branches of the university and college, and perhaps all the normal schools, and it would not matter whether the person obtaining a degree did his work at Eugene or Corvallis."

"The board has many things to consider before it puts such a plan into operation. It is faced with a complexity of detail. But it appears likely that the board will find its solution of Oregon's higher education problem in the combination of the two institutions."

"The Portland Times"

"In the survey of Oregon's higher educational institutions made by the federal department of education, it is brought out that these institutions enroll 76.3 per cent of all students of higher learning, leaving but 24.7 per cent to attend private colleges."

"This proportion is decidedly different from that which holds throughout the United States, where public supported institutions carry 59.6 per cent of this student load, and private institutions take care of 40.4 per cent."

"Oregon is abundantly supplied with small colleges, some of them laboring under serious financial difficulties in their struggle to live up to their fine traditions and to justify the lofty ambitions of their founders. Now that an order of economy may curb some of the excessive expenditures of the state-supported schools, it would seem that the privately endowed colleges should come to occupy a larger place in the educational picture."

"Another fact revealed by the survey is the relatively small number of Oregon students majoring in the liberal arts. The percentage taking these courses is but 20.5 as compared with the 31.8 per cent reported in the totals for the United States."

"It is in this field that the private institution finds its best opportunity. Technical schools require expensive laboratories and elaborate equipment, but it is sufficient for the humanities to have an inspiring teacher, a few text and reference books, and to add

such simple laboratories as will introduce the elements of science to the inquiring mind.

Maybe it will be a good thing all around for the students as well as the taxpayers if the state does not try to furnish free education to everybody in everything—the topmost round of professional training—and the smaller college is allowed to render the special service for which it is best qualified."

Statesman Dubious

The Salem Statesman urges that the normal schools be kept on an independent basis if a consolidation is effected. It says:

"It is somewhat unfortunate that the necessity of immediate action to contract expenditures at the state higher institutions comes at the same time that the new board is undertaking the administrative and functional reorganization of the higher schools."

"There is danger, which the board fully realizes, of being precipitate on the latter questions because of the urgency of economy. This makes it somewhat difficult for the board to develop a program of progressive alteration of educational policies based upon the findings of the survey committee."

"After listening to the arguments of the college presidents at the hearing Monday we believe that one of the first matters to decide is the question of a unified administration, and in question in turn hinges very much on the determination of the functions of the separate institutions at Eugene and Corvallis. If the survey report is carried out, then the school at Corvallis becomes automatically a coordinate branch of the university, and may as well have such designation and the two schools placed under one executive."

"If, however, the state college is to remain essentially a school of applied science, providing technical and industrial training with merely the necessary cultural studies for a well-rounded education, then the institutions should be kept distinct and under a separate organization. It would be folly to rush in with a single head unless the functions of the school are to be changed and made of university character and grade. There are numerous arguments to be made on each side of this proposition and we offer no opinion of our own on the point because our own mind is not made up."

Preserve the Normals

"We are quite dubious about the wisdom of Pres. Hall's plan for a single administration of the five institutions. This would put the three normal schools under the university administration. The tendency would be to further dwarf these essential institutions. They would be sort of distant experimental stations operated by remote control."
