Oh boy—I mean girl—what one of you as calico-clad kiddies could forget the wedge of creamy custardness Grandma offered as a prize for good work? And as a special treat (probably so that you and your young brother wouldn't fight over who got the largest piece), she'd bake a little pie for each of you. And her cookies!—great rounds of fruity deliciousness or crisp, sugary bits! Or Sally Lunns, stirred up in a hurry—served some-times hot, sometimes cold. And back to pies again—instead of springtime sulphur and molasses, she cured what ailed you (usually spring lassitude) with rhubarb disguised in pie of course, for you were scornful of the humble "pie-plant" that grew along the fence.

Reminiscing brings mouth-watering memories, for Grandmother knew her psychology—a happy tummy means a contented soul. Lovely lady, with your workworn hands and the brave blue of your twinkling eyes... somehow our eyes grew tearful and a lump comes into our throats... Rhubarb Pie
1½ cups rhubarb cut in cubes, 1 cup sugar, 3 tablespoons cream, yolks of 2 eggs, 1 tablespoon flour.
Mix all ingredients together and cook in double boiler until thickened, add to cooked pie shell (not very brown). Allow to bake in moderate oven about six or eight minutes. Cover with meringue made from 2 egg whites beaten stiff, 2 tablespoons

sugar, ½ teaspoon vanilla. Bake at 300 degrees for about ten minutes.
Fruit Cookies
1½ cups sugar, 2 eggs well beaten, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, ¼ teaspoon cloves, 1 cup currants, ½ cup raisins, ½ cup shortening, 1 teaspoon soda, ½ teaspoon nutmeg, ½ cup butter-milk.
Flour to make stiff enough to drop. Cream sugar and shortening. Add well-beaten eggs and dry ingredients sifted with two cups flour, alternately with buttermilk and fruit (figs and prunes may be used). Then add flour enough to make very stiff drop batter. Bake at 400 degrees for about ten minutes.
Sally Lunns
Cream well one-half cup shortening and one cup sugar. Add two egg yolks, two cups flour, two teaspoons baking powder, one-half teaspoon salt—sifted together—alternately with one-half cup sweet milk.
Flavor with one teaspoon vanilla; fold in the two beaten egg whites. Drop into muffin tins and bake at 400 degrees for about fifteen minutes. These are good split and used as individual short-cakes.
