

MEDICAL CONCLAVE PLANS MADE HERE BY LOCAL DOCTORS

Preliminary plans for entertaining physicians and surgeons of the state in their annual convention here October 22, 23 and 24 were made by a committee of the Lane County Medical Society in a meeting at the Osburn hotel Monday.

The convocation originally was to have been held earlier in September, but was changed to October at the suggestion of Eugene doctors, who pointed out that greater facilities for entertainment will be available at that date.

On the night of October 24 the visiting physicians will be guests at the night football game between the University of Oregon and the Oregon State Beavers. This game has come to be a leading sport event.

A golf tournament for the doctors will be one of the high points of the convention, the committee announced. This will be held Saturday.

Plans to entertain the women's auxiliary and the wives of visiting physicians are in charge of Mrs. Gaven Dyott.

Clinics will be held at the Eugene and Pacific Christian hospitals during the convention. Papers prepared by many of the foremost physicians and surgeons in the country will be read, and a number of distinguished men will appear on the speaking program.

Burglar Inventor Of Pickproof Lock

SAN QUENTIN PRISON, Cal. — (AP)—Revising an old truism: "set a lockpicker to make a pickproof lock."

Harold Marks, burglar, has invented a lock, he says, he himself couldn't pick unless he knew the secret of its operation.

The lock is so designed that a key will not enter it, once it is set. Unless a secret word is first spelled out by whirling a lettered dial attached to the lock, much as a number is dialed on a modern telephone. Marks is serving a term of some five years to life for a burglary committed in San Diego.

LANE SECOND IN STATE FAIR FUND

SALEM, June 2.—(AP)—County fairs in Oregon this year will receive \$203,258.68 toward their support from the one-twentieth of a mill tax levy assessed against real property for this purpose, the secretary of state announced today. Of this sum \$1,000 will be used for the northwest turkey show in Douglas county, as provided by the last legislature.

Where counties receiving their apportionment do not hold fairs this year, the money will be applied to county roads, the law provides. Most of the counties hold these annual agricultural exhibits, and more funds are raised within the counties to complete financing the activity. The state fair at Salem is not financed by this fund.

Multnomah county will receive \$10,682.17 of the total appropriation while Lane county is second with \$27,315.50, Marion county third with \$20,000, and Clatsop county fourth with \$20,000. Umatilla county will receive \$23,369 and Klamath county \$20,111.

Urges Chinese to Print Own Stamps

PEIPING, China. — (AP)—Y. D. Shen, former secretary to Marshal Chang Hsueh-liang, northern war lord, who recently was appointed director of the bureau of engraving and printing, is seeking to cancel a contract with an English firm to print China's stamps.

He argues that the livelihood of 2,000 skilled workmen in the bureau is endangered by the contract. The agreement with the English firm was made during the northern rebellion. Since the rebellion has collapsed and the bureau is capable of printing all the stamps needed by China, Shen says the contract should be canceled.

Spanish Bullfight Season Is Poor One

MADRID.—(AP)—The bullfighting season is about one-third gone, but has failed to get out of the morass of mediocrity in which it started off.

An unusually dry February caused it to start earlier than usual, but the unseasonable cold and windy days of March and April did much to diminish interest in bull-fights—and the Spanish national fiesta requires heat and sunshine to make it successful.

May is considered—either with or without reason—as the deadly month in bull-fighting. Several of the big heroes of the bull ring were killed in May, which is the busy month for bull-fighters, as it has several important holidays.

Catching Snakes Is Profitable Business

MERRIMACK, Wis.—(AP)—Capturing rattlesnakes alive was Elmer Kettel's hobby when he was a boy; now it is a profitable business for him every spring.

Every April and May for 20 years he has hunted rattlesnakes, bull snakes, blue racers, and spotted adders in the granite bluffs on his farm near Devil's lake state park. He sells live snakes to carnivals, circuses, zoological museums and laboratories and tanned skins to leather manufacturers who use them for women's shoes and purses. He also finds a market for rattlesnake venom, used to make an antidote serum.

Springfield Board Lets Wood Work

SPRINGFIELD, June 2.—(Special)—Fred Wilson of Marcola was awarded the contract for supplying wood to Springfield schools at a meeting of the board of education Monday night.

He will supply 200 cords to the high school and Brattain and Lincoln grade schools for the year.

he intended to rebuild. He saved his papers and office equipment. Creswell people expressed appreciation for the help of the Eugene fire department, which made a run to the blaze with Fire Chief William Nussbaum in charge. The blaze developed such extreme heat that it might easily have leaped to nearby houses, and had it been blown across the railroad tracks and highway to the row of business buildings there a large portion of the town would probably have been lost.

It was a spectacular fire, and several hundred persons gathered on the railroad track to watch it. Many volunteered to help in the fire-fighting, and many household kettles were seen being used to put out small fires started by the big blaze.
