

SUIT TO CONDEMN ROAD WAY STARTED

Condemnation of 24 acres of land along the right-of-way of the Oregon coast highway in western Lane county is sought in action brought by the Lane county court, representing the county, against Viola Lee Pratt, county assessor, filed by the district attorney's office in circuit court, assessor that the court offered \$1200.50 for the property, which is needed for right-of-way purposes. This offer was declined, and the county asks that the property be condemned and the owner paid that amount.

This is one of a series of condemnation suits brought by the county in obtaining right-of-way for state highway work in this county. Several suits have been filed recently seeking to condemn property along the route of the McKenzie highway in the Gate Creek-Nimrod section.

Claire Langton, dean of the school of health education, Oregon State college, Corvallis, was the installing officer and presented the charter to the group here. Paul R. Washke, director of the men's gymnasium here, gave the introductory talk. R. K. Cutler read the athletic records of Sigma Delta Psi. Presentation of honor keys and certificates of membership to members was made by Dr. John F. Bovard, dean of the university school of physical education.

Mr. Washke was elected president of the group and Mr. Cutler was named secretary-treasurer.
