NEW YORK, June 13.—(AP)—The
stock market closed today through two
hours today, but managed to make up
much of an early decline. Net changes
were irregularly up and nominal.
Bulls were realizing in their first
hour, losing 1 to 4, and their heaviness
had an effect on other groups.
However, shorts covered quietly dur-
ing the latter half of the session and
the losses of either substantially
reduced or eliminated. Sales were
500,000 shares.

U. S. Steel closed half a point low-
er, but it had been off 3/8. Ameri-
can Telephone, Chesapeake and Ohio,
Standard Oil of California, North
American and General Electric fin-
ished about a point off. There were
narrow gains in Warner Brothers,
Fox, Kenecott, General Motors, and
American Smelting and New York
Central. Mack trucks was strong, re-
flecting reports that the company is
operating at a profit.

International Telephone continued
its advance, the company is said to
contemplate acquisition of one of the
Kreuger and Toll Telephone units.
