

CULTURAL CLUB TO BE FORMED HERE

Organization of a Roycroft Juno club, national honorary society for the advancement of the study of cultural subjects, is under way in Eugene. Membership is invitational.

Mrs. Anita Thomas of New York City, organizer of the society, is here, carrying on the work of organizing. She is at the Eugene hotel and is being assisted by Miss Louise Frick of San Francisco.

The Roycroft Juno, as outlined by those in charge, is a cultural club to provide opportunities for discussion of cultural subjects and current events and to encourage members in self-expression and exchange of ideas. Subjects which will be discussed are business and economics, literature and

oratory, history and government, science and invention, painting, sculpture, music, poetry, philosophy, etc.

The chapter will hold bi-monthly meetings at the Eugene hotel and when organization is complete, the first round table discussion will be conducted by a prominent local leader who will lead the group on the Socratic method of discussion. Leaders in the society say the first Juno in the country was inspired by Benjamin Franklin in Philadelphia when he was 19 years of age. This group is to the founding of the Philadelphia library which is now being continued as the American Philosophical society.

The Roycroft Juno shops in East Aurora, New York, founded by Elbert Hubbard in 1895 and development of the Juno movement by Elbert Hubbard are part of the organization.

125 New Road Signs Placed in County

Roads of Lane county are to be posted with 125 additional road signs under a project started Friday by the Oregon State Automobile association. All of the signs will be placed on county roads in needed places, usually at cross roads.

A representative of the state association was here in May to log the county roads and locate places where signs were needed. The signs were then painted and brought here a few days ago.

County Engineer P. M. Morse has cooperated with the association in locating and placing the signs, and the county will furnish the posts.

An incidental of interest is that signs prepared for citing the route to the football community of Smithfield-Franklin bear the name Franklin.
