

Local Grain Harvesting Starts; Stock Prices in Slight Rally

EARLY LOSS IS RECOVERED SOME ON N. Y. MARKET

NEW YORK, July 13.—(AP)—All though New York stock market a rally in the early trading today, prices rallied slightly from the lows during the ensuing hours and closed with moderate net gains.

ADVANCE ON EGGS IS LOOKED FOR

PORTLAND, Ore., July 13.—(AP)—Talk in the egg trade here Monday morning indicated that an advance in the market was expected early this week. Conditions throughout the Pacific coast indicate a rise here. Other markets moved higher late in the week, while the one remained steady. The Portland market, however, advanced two cents the previous week while the others on the coast were not so strong.

Most buyers here opened the week fully steady. Weather conditions, with the exception of the first two days of last week, have been very favorable for production. The market is holding in spite of this, however, and an advance might easily follow any less favorable production circumstances, talk in the trade indicates.

The first crop of California Gravenstein apples of the season was received here Monday by Pacific Fruit and Produce company. These apples are of good quality and more to the trade at \$2.50.

Small sized oranges were advanced 25 cents here as the week opened. Both logan and raspberries were higher, but the one remained steady. The market is holding in spite of this, however, and an advance might easily follow any less favorable production circumstances, talk in the trade indicates.

Weakness developed in virtually all sections of the melon market Monday. Conditions in the market are around 25 cents. Turkey cantaloupes replaced Imperial valley and Delano offerings in many instances. Hop quotations on these are \$2.50. Delano had best moving at top of \$3. Honeydew melons were quoted at \$1.50 for large flat crates. Watermelons were off a quarter at 25 cents.

Apricot offerings from The Dallas region were more plentiful as the week opened. Prices were off fractionally with the general market at 65 to 70 cents a box. California peaches were selling at \$1 a box, off 25 cents from Saturday.

Seedless grapes from California are in greater supply and a decline of 50 cents has been noted. They are now going to the trade at \$2.

Field grown cucumbers were down fractionally in Monday's trade here. These are quoted at 60 cents with extra butter being 15 cents more. California offerings of tomatoes were 25 cents higher here Monday and those from The Dallas were down a dime. Market stock is quoted at \$2.75. Delano had best moving at top of \$3. Honeydew melons were quoted at \$1.50 for large flat crates. Watermelons were off a quarter at 25 cents.

NEW WHEAT WILL BE QUOTED ABOUT 50 CENTS BUSHEL

Cutting of wheat starts in this section this week. Harvesting here is getting under way about two weeks earlier than usual. However, the fall grain is running about a normal crop, reports the Eugene Milling Elevator company, from estimates brought in by farmers. The spring grain will run below normal due to the drought, the two crops combined to run about 70 per cent of normal. It is said.

Prices on the new wheat will be about 50 cents a bushel, it is said. They are uncertain however, due to the summer changes in the wheat market the past week. Prices in the valley run considerably higher than in eastern Oregon on the new wheat because there is a big demand for it in this section.

Threshing on barley has already been under way. It is quoted at \$1.80 a ton, buying price. It is said.

The new crop will run about \$18 a ton, buying price, it is said.

HAY Baling ON

Baling of oats and vetch hay in this section is practically completed. Baling of second crop of alfalfa is due to start about Tuesday. Considerable activity is reported in buying of all kinds of local hay now. Prices remain about the same as quoted for the past week.

PRICE LISTS CHANGE

Several changes were reported on Monday for the vegetable and fruit list of local produce.

Gravenstein apples are coming in now to add variety to the green apple. Both the Gravenstein and Yellow Pippin are quoted around 3 cents a pound, buying price.

Red raspberries are shooting higher and are quite scarce. They are listed at \$1.50 to \$2 a crate, buying price. Loganberries are quoted around \$1.25 and \$1.50 and are rather scarce.

Outdoor cucumbers are coming in.
