

CHICAGO ON BRINK OF DISASTER OVER COUNTY TAX BILLS

CHICAGO, Jan. 1.—(AP)—Impetuous Chicago, balked by a "taxpayers' strike" for four years, faced a bankruptcy today as the result of a decision voiding the county tax bills for 1928 and 1929.

The ruling by County Judge Edgar J. Jarecki, who said that the assessment rolls for those years were fraudulent and invalid, meant that \$140,000,000 owed in back taxes could not be collected until a reassessment was completed, or a successful appeal prosecuted.

It also meant that the 1930 bills, based on the 1928 assessment and due, would likely bring very little in the way of revenue to the city, and that the city's schools, city and state legislators, meeting in special session to solve the city's financial trouble, had already suggested that Chicago be placed in the hands of a receiver.

Mayor Anton Cermak had said: "If Judge Jarecki rules against us, we must have to close the city hall. Judge Jarecki warned that if taxpayers continued to make such 'unjust levies,' a crisis might be precipitated 'the results of which might be foretold.'"

The ruling came while new efforts were being made to sell tax warrants so that teachers could be given a little of the several months' back salary due them. If the decision upholding Mayor Cermak's said no tax warrants could be sold and bonds would depreciate, city and state leaders were attempting to agree on a plan so that the state legislature, which meets next week, can authorize the taxing machinery of the county. Many of the officials expressed the opinion that today's ruling made it imperative that the legislature fund the three years' taxes, or at least those for 1930.

The suit in Judge Jarecki's court was the result of the activities of an association of real estate taxpayers which has contended that personal property had not paid its just share of taxes. Judge Jarecki agreed.

Secretary of Navy Being Called Things

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 1.—(AP)—Secretary of the Navy Adams was called "misguided and egotistical" tonight by Director of Public Safety Schofield in elevating a charge which had been discharged from the naval reserves for wearing a naval uniform in obtaining liquor credits.

Charles P. Lang, the officer, took oath as a sergeant shortly before the charge was dropped from the list of naval reserves several weeks ago.

"Lang was elevated to show him that police work is rewarded," Schofield said. "He was made a martyr by the navy by a misguided and egotistical whiff who has no high regard for the constitution."

Secretary Adams ordered Lang dropped from the reserves.

American Airways Reduces Its Fares
