

Egg Buying Prices Cut; Stocks Make Good Gain

YEAR'S LOW MARK REACHED IN LIST GIVEN WEDNESDAY

The expected drop in buying prices on eggs, mentioned in Tuesday's Register-Guard, came Wednesday with New York grades and extra buying prices lower, as well as the public market retail prices being down. The drops followed similar cuts in the wholesale prices.

The egg prices are down to the lowest mark of the year with the N. Y. grades, buying prices, listed down to 16 cents on extra, 14 cents on standards, 12 cents on firsts, 12 cents on mediums, store prices, buying quotations, down to 15 and 17 cents on standards and 11-14 cents on the mediums. On Jan. 27, 1931, eggs dropped to 10c on extra, buying price. The cut in wholesale prices forecast Tuesday went into effect Wednesday morning, extra being listed at 18 cents, mediums at 16 cents, and extra at 14 cents.

There are fewer eggs in the Eugene area at this time than there was for the same season a year ago, because there are not so many flocks, so producers of this section of the Pacific are not suffering as heavily as some in the mid-west. Those farmers and producers depending on egg money as a big item, however, are pretty hard hit by the steadily decreasing prices of the past week.

It's early to start buying for storage yet and it's a hard guess when the season will end this year, according to Ralph Perry of the Pacific Coast Poultry Producers' association. Last year the association started buying for storage on Jan. 22, but it is uncertain when buying will start this year.

Heavy Hens Down
Heavy hens dropped a cent here Wednesday, being listed down to 14 cents. No other changes were reported for poultry.

Turkey prices quoted by Swift and company, which started receiving Tuesday, are 18 cents on No. 1's, 14 cents on mediums, and 12 cents on 2's. The plant will be receiving for the balance of the week.

Butter, butterfat, livestock, grains, and vegetables were all unchanged in prices Wednesday.

OVER-PRODUCTION IS CAUSE OF EGG CUTS

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 13.—(AP)—A reactionary trade trend in the egg market appears the result of over-production. The result of depression caused by pressure of cold storage stocks, but lack of consuming ability. Reasonable increases in production of eggs throughout the United States has been intense the current period. The normal slack production period has not appeared to date this season. The east and

the midwest along with the Pacific slope have been producing eggs at an abnormal rate all through the fall and winter months.

There has been an actual increase in sales of eggs during the fall and winter months to date this season as compared with other recent periods. This is reflected clearly in the early disappearance of the cold storage supply along with takings of fresh eggs in volume heretofore unknown during the cold period.

The unwillingness of speculative interests to take on a risk for storage at this period appears due to two conditions: the lack of bank credit together with the extreme eagerness of the season.

Today's selling price of eggs on the Portland market is so low as the lowest price reached last season. During the last few days of January the price dropped to 18c dozen for extra, the present top dollar for extra.

Sales of butter locally are more liberal with general trade more or less steady at the late declines. Retailers report increased call as a result of the recent price cuts. Butterfat is unchanged.

General eagerness is reflected in the market for live chickens as a result of the increased offerings, due to the sharp drop in the price of eggs. Practically all sorts are affected.

Movement of turkeys is still more or less of nominal character with No. 1 stock quoted in a limited way down to 25c. Scarcely sufficient business is showing to establish prices inasmuch as freezers are offering only 18c for No. 1 birds in Idaho and other interior points.

There is a very good demand for country killed lamb according to the Portland Produce Co. Sales are being made of best stuff at 10 to 10 1/2 cents lb. Veal market is also good.

There is a fractional loss in the price of country killed hogs here as a result of the arrival of considerable light fat stuff which is selling slowly 6 to 7c lb. The latter is extreme top. Market for potatoes is very slow. Little activity is indicated in the potato stock as a result of mixed marketing conditions at the source. Yakima is pouring its supplies into the local market and getting away with more than its share.

Over supply of poor lettuce from the Sacramento section is clogging local trade, resulting in loss to practically all who touch it. Sales are being made at whatever the buyer is willing to offer.

Montana French trout endive is being offered at 50c lb. Florida eggplant of quality is moving at 15c lb. Broccoli head is still finding favor at \$1.25 to \$1.50 crate. California broccoli is selling up to \$1.25 for best.

First offering of Calamita Vista celery, an offering at \$3.00 crate. Mexican peas are selling at 50c 20 lb. with good quality. Those rhubarb, tomatoes and cucumbers unchanged.

East Side Market
There is a good demand for cauliflower on the East Side Farmers' wholesale market during the Wednesday session. Offerings were of good volume considering the season. Sales showed a spread of 50c to \$1 crate with the bulk 65 to 80c. Cabbage was firmer and in a limited way up to \$1 for fancy stuff. Spinach market was steady at late prices.

Apples were in supply with no change in price conditions. All root vegetables continued in active call at recent values. Brussels sprouts held \$1 box for best. Summer rhubarb rhubarb was priced \$1.75 for choice, \$2 for fancy and \$2.25 for extra fancy 15c.

RESPONSE TO NEW CREDIT PLANS IS CAUSE OF UPTURN

NEW YORK, Jan. 13.—(AP)—One of the broadest advances in weeks seen many prominent issues up to 6 points in the stock market today. The closing tone was strong, and the turnover exceeded 2,000,000 shares.

A reversal of the protracted decline in U. S. government bonds in the bond market, together with reports of federal reserve credit expansion, gave fresh impetus to the upturn in security prices, which began a week ago today.
