The progress is reported on the S. I. tracks to make room for the highway between Mapleton and Cushman.

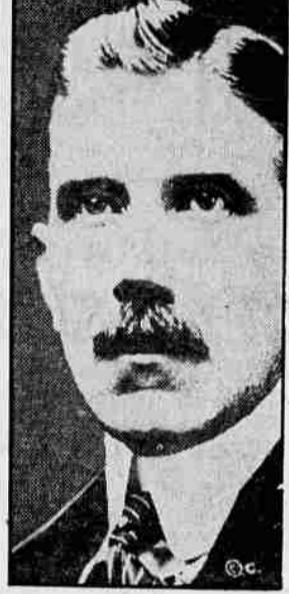

ENTIRE PRUSSIAN CABINET DEPOSED

Franz Bracht Takes Over Duties As Dictator Of German State

BERLIN, July 21.—(AP)—Prussia's new dictatorship moved smoothly into action today, but under the surface calm there was considerable resentment at the imposition of martial law by yesterday's presidential decree.

Formal proceedings were begun today against Albert Grzesinski, socialist member of the Prussian parliament, and his two assistants, Bernhard Weiss and Albert Heimsberg, who were arrested yesterday after refusing to submit to a federal order displacing them.

Despite martial law, however, two men were killed and a number were injured in political riots last night in southwestern Berlin.
