SMALL ROAD JOBS STARTED ON COAST

A few small road projects to be started soon in western Lane were inspected by County Commissioner Clinton Hurd last two days. Grading and widening of turnouts on the Fiddle creek road which runs into Douglas county will be done under a special tax voted by residents of the district. The road from the Oregon Coast highway into Mercer lake will be given three inches of crushed rock in places to keep the road passable in the winter. Mr. Hurd said that the state highway commission would be asked to approve a 60 foot right of way instead of 50 feet on the section of the Siuslaw highway which passes through Acme, northwest of Ushman. In order to get a right of way of 80 feet, buildings would have to be moved and sidewalks of the town torn up. This would result in quite an expense to the county. A 60 foot right of way would be sufficient, Mr. Hurd believes. A large fill is to be built at this point. The Sea Lion caves on Heceta Head have been improved and are now ready for visitors. A new path from the highway to the caves has been built on solid rock, and a railing is tied into the rock to make the descent safe. A 75 foot tower has been built at the caves. This is a private enterprise.

Secondary Road Survey Requested

County Surveyor P. M. Morse has been requested by E. A. Collier, division state highway engineer, to make a survey of the county's secondary highway program and prepare a budget for five years' work. The survey was started Thursday, but the county's program has not been projected ahead five years and figures will not be available for some time. The state highway department operates on a five year plan, and since taking over market roads as secondary highways has asked the counties to prepare figures so plans can be made ahead.
