Flight Prepared

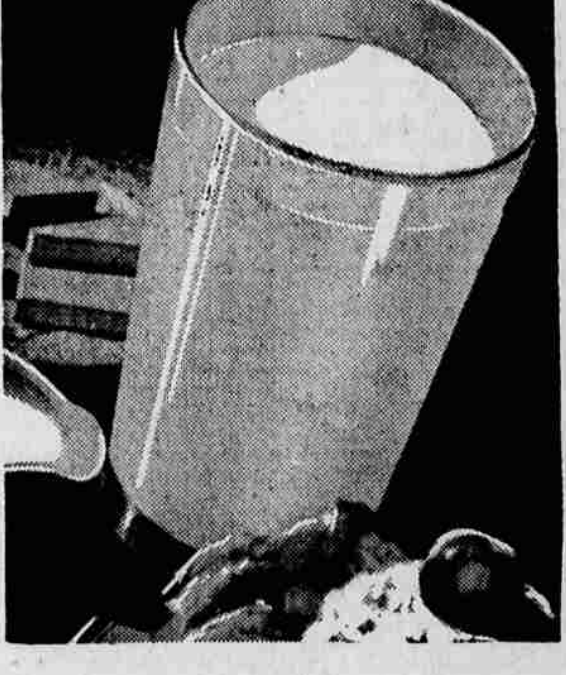
