reluctant in part the present business between Portland and Eugene and build for diverted traffic on short hauls with greater number of round trips per day.

"4. Readjustment of rail freight rates influenced by tidewater outlet.

"5. Growth of Willamette valley population.

"6. Establishment of manufacturing plants with payrolls and consuming power.

"7. Establishment of colonists on land within Eugene's trading area on a definite land settlement program.

Economy Pointed Out

"It seems logical for the future... that Eugene will sooner or later find it economical to utilize tidewater facilities to strengthen its position as the principal distributing center for the upper Willamette valley. The statement might even be made more emphatic by stating the town may even be forced to seek tidewater in order to hold its position should other valley towns dispute Eugene's claim to the title. This situation is not unlikely."

The future of the coast depends, says Mr. Lomax, upon the ability of port administrators to show that "it is cheaper to ship through a tidewater gateway with one handling from ocean carrier to the land vehicle than by hauling the same commodity a longer distance with the probability of duplicate handling."

The major problems confronting the ports are summed up under four headings, construction of harbor works, financing harbor development, efficiency in administration and holding of commerce originating by both land and sea carriers.

Mr. Lomax refers to the offer of the port commission of the Port of Siuslaw to give that port to Lane county to insure greater development.

elsewhere as well, and must make every effort to justify their existence. This can be done by adopting a constructive policy of work, by harmony in organization, and by eliminating entirely time and money spent in controversies.

In outlining the policy to be followed in the future Dr. Kerr stated that the identity of all institutions should be preserved. It will be the plan, he pointed out, to have a president for each institution, with the chancellor as the coordinating officer.

The morale of staff members must be restored and enthusiasm for the future developed, he declared, and this can best be done by complete cooperation between members of all departments and all institutions.

"In accepting the chancellorship I have a full realization of the tremendous responsibilities involved," Chancellor Kerr said. "We will need the utmost in cooperation from every staff member in order to make the organization a complete success.

"I have no pet theories of education, and plan no experiments. Any changes will be made only after close study and then made strictly upon the merits of the case. The main objective shall at all times be what is best for the institutions in the light of their service to the state.

"Our policy will always be constructive. Constructive thinking and constructive working will be the best means of obtaining our ends in education under this system. I believe that the best results can be obtained from efficient organization, but we must be careful not to let the organization itself take too much of our efforts. We should function at all times with a definite purpose to turn out the best product in education—that is the young men and women with well trained minds and habits of industry and inquiry."

A plea for inter-institutional as well as inter-departmental harmony was made by Chancellor Kerr. Staff members of all institutions should work together on their mutual problems, aims and objectives as do staff members of different departments within the respective institutions, he pointed out.

"With the institutions working in harmony, with the friendly cooperation of alumni and friends, and the confidence of the people of the state in the organization, we can now feel that the future of higher education in Oregon is bright."
