

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK, OCT. 9-15 TO BE OBSERVED HERE

National fire prevention week, October 9 to October 15, will be observed in Eugene with radio talks, addresses before luncheon clubs and the Eugene schools on fire prevention activities. It was announced Friday by William Newbaum, chief of the Eugene fire department.

Governor Julius Meier has issued a proclamation setting aside this week as fire prevention week. The proclamation is as follows:

"For the past three years Oregon's average annual contribution to the fire demon has been more than 80 human lives, injury to over 150 persons and the destruction of property to the value of eight million dollars.

"Nearly twenty-five million dollars of our staple economic resources was sacrificed on the altar of carelessness in the past three years. Fully one-half of these values is represented by industrial and commercial resources—less than 60 per cent of which is never replaced.

"This careless waste of our fundamental resources is prodigious and is gradually sapping the economic vitality of our great commonwealth.

"That these resources may in future be conserved to the benefit of prosperity of the Oregon public and, in keeping with the proclamation of the president of the United States in the interest of fire prevention and control.

"Now, therefore, I, Julius L. Meier, governor of the state of Oregon, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me, do hereby proclaim October 9 to October 15, 1932, as fire prevention week and earnestly urge the people, the press and all

civic, patriotic, fraternal and industrial organizations of the commonwealth, to put forth their united efforts toward the elimination of the loss and suffering which follow in the wake of preventable fires."

"TIGER SHARK" IS INTERESTING FILM

Edward G. Robinson is portrayed in another of those rare character parts he is famed for, this time as captain of a crew of Portuguese, fishing for tuna and battling the sharks.

The picture has something of the sweep of "Moby Dick," only it is sharks instead of a whale in this film. The romance is even better than in "Moby Dick" because the book, "Moby Dick," had no woman in it. Some fine educational scenes on fishing off the southern California and in Mexican waters are shown in "Tiger Shark."

Robinson as Mike Mascarena is in "Tiger Shark" what Barrymore was as Ahab in "Moby Dick" except Robinson's character is more kindly and philosophic as well as humorous.

It's worth the whole evening off to go and see and hear "Mike" as he gives the plea to St. Peter to allow one of his seamen to enter heaven, even though the dead man's legs were torn from the body by the sharks.

Followers of Robinson will not be disappointed in "Tiger Shark" for he has one of his best roles yet. Richard Arlen as Mike's pal who falls in love with Mike's wife, and Zita Johann as the wife, are the other "main" in the cast, although several sailors of the crew steal part of the comedy relief.
