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U. O. Fire Survey To Be Begun Soon

The annual survey of the University of Oregon dormitories, fraternities and sororities relative to fire prevention will be conducted by the Eugene fire department in cooperation with the state fire marshal's office, starting the first of next week, it was announced Friday.

This inspection is held each year at the start of the fall term. Karl Onthank, dean of personnel, has requested that the survey be started as soon as possible and the state fire marshal delegated George W. Stokes, deputy state fire marshal, who is in Eugene at present, to conduct the survey with the assistance of local firemen.

All dormitories, fraternities and sororities will be inspected for recommendations for fire safety observation.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Oct. 7.—(AP)—Amos Alonzo Stagg, grizzled veteran of the football wars, returns to his alma mater, Yale, today with a Chicago university team which he hopes will take the Bulldogs' measure in the bowl tomorrow.

The 70-year-old coach, who was an end on Caspar Whitney's first all-American team in 1888 and pitched Yale to five consecutive baseball championships, has not seen Yale play for 34 years.
