

WOMAN'S MURDER LAID TO DENTIST BY POLICE OFFICER

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 26.—(AP)—The body of Dr. Squire P. Bevier, sought for the slaying of Mrs. Josephine Elder, 71, last Thursday in Dr. Bevier's dental office here, was found today in a garage in the rear of the dentist's home, Chief of Police Joseph A. Gerk announced.

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 26.—(AP)—After investigation of the slaying of Mrs. Josephine Elder, 71, Chief of Police Joseph A. Gerk said he believed the elderly woman was slain by her dentist, Dr. Squire P. Bevier, 60, in a rage during a quarrel over the quality of dental work he did for her.

Chief Gerk said he also thought the dentist ended his life by jumping into the Mississippi river from the municipal bridge.

The theory of a quarrel over a dental plate made by Dr. Bevier was strengthened when Conway Elder, son of the slain woman, and a former judge of the Missouri supreme court, said his mother was dissatisfied with Dr. Bevier's work. When she left home for his office Thursday she said she intended to have the dentist "make it right," Elder said.

The finding of her battered body in Dr. Bevier's office yesterday, and the unexpected appearance of Dr. Bevier at his home Thursday with scratches on his face, a bruise under his right eye, and a torn necktie, gave evidence Mrs. Elder had put up a fight for her life.

A note was found in the dentist's desk which read in part: "This d—n blackmailer got here—me for the river," and upon this note Chief Gerk based his theory the dentist drowned himself.

Portland Youth Is Shot in Robbery

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 26.—(AP)—Edward Jones, 16, was shot by police today when he and another youth were caught in a grocery store. Patrolmen Bernard and Lechleider found the two boys attempting to rob the store and when they fled, the officers fired at them. Both escaped at the time, but later Jones sought medical attention for a leg wound and was arrested. He told police his partner was Al Robby, 17.

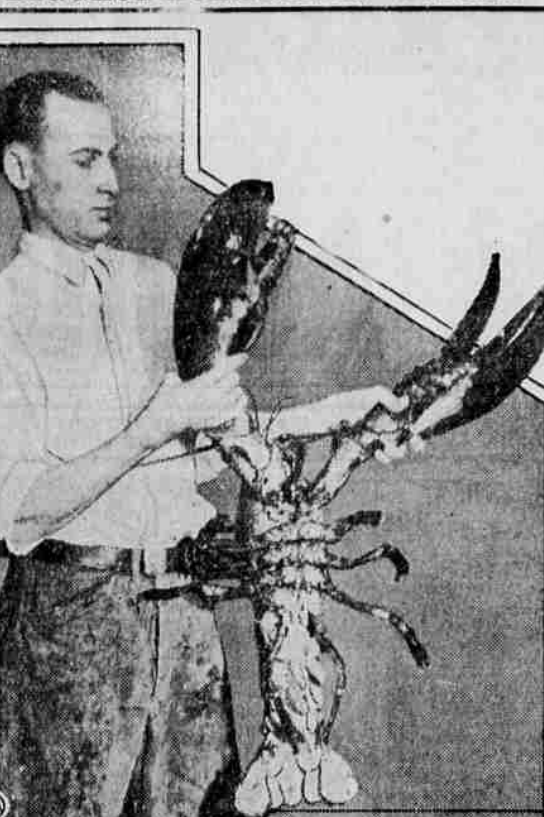

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APPROVAL OF BEER IS EXPECTED SOON AFTER NEW YEAR'S

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26.—(AP)—Congressional approval of the house 32 per cent beer bill this session is definitely expected by most senate leaders and plans have been made for speeding action on the measure after the Christmas recess.

With no evidence of a concerted dry movement to stop the bill, both republican and democratic leaders forecast its approval by congress at this session, but agreed the measure's ultimate fate rested with President Hoover.

Chairman Norris, of the senate judiciary committee, which now has the bill in charge, announced he would ask the full committee to handle the bill rather than delay progress by referring to a subcommittee.

Norris called a meeting of the committee for Monday, but a check-up disclosed that a majority of the members have left the capital for the holiday period. This will postpone action until January.

Norris said, however, he would attempt to have a meeting later in the week, and failing in this would call the group together in special session immediately after the recess.

While Norris was announcing plans for speeding the legislation, interviews with members of his committee revealed a clear majority for modification of the Volstead act, indicating a favorable report on beer.
