WASHINGTON, June 5.—(AP)—Ferdinand Pecora, senate committee counsel for the J. P. Morgan inquiry, said at today's hearing that his staff had been denied access to books of the Van Sweringen company in Cleveland.

WASHINGTON, June 5.—(AP)—An issue tax reducing transaction involving stock deals by a Morgan firm and also by his wife posed a very question today for senate investigators of J. P. Morgan and a decision on which was deferred tomorrow while the inquiry into the transaction was continued.

Young Lamont on Grill
In closed session, before hearing by J. P. Morgan, Ferdinand Pecora, senate committee counsel, today authorized to question Thomas Lamont on stock sales by him late 1929 which was reflected in claims losses on income tax returns.

Some committee members said Pecora had claimed Lamont sold a block stock to his wife, asserted losses it for income tax purposes and repurchased it.

On the other hand, different members of the committee stated that Pecora had been told Mrs. Lamont had sold her stock about the same time as her husband and had sold them he bought, but that Pecora had not said the sale was direct.

No claim of illegality was raised Pecora, it was said; and John W. Peckham, Jr., counsel for the Morgan firm, had challenged authority of the committee to go into the income tax matter. He was said to have pointed the law against publication of income tax returns.

Influence Is Criticized

Banks was taken to the hospital on May 22 and has been there since.

3-C CAMPUS IN RECRUITS FOR FORESTS

Armory Here Busy Getting Men Examined For Woods Duty

WORK TO START SOON

Training Camp Preparation Not Required For Local Groups

With 19 of Lane county's quota of 114 Civilian Conservation Corps men already in the field, the balance of 95 were examined at the armory Monday and will be sent out to camps Tuesday. Sixty will be sent to the Steamboat camp east of Roseburg and the other 30 will be sent to the Sisters camp near Bend.

Meanwhile, Polk county's quota of 35 men and 20 men from the Lane county quota of 50 were being assembled at Albany for preliminary examinations Monday. They will arrive in Eugene Tuesday for complete physical examinations and will be equipped here for detail to the Steamboat camp.

Armory Is Busy Place
Lincoln county's complete quota of 20 men, Benton county's total quota of 35 men, and the remaining 20 of Lane county's quota will be sent direct to the Cape Creek camp on the coast Tuesday.

The armory was a busy place Monday as the physical examinations of the men were carried on under the direction of Major J. W. Smith, Jr., district medical officer, Lt. Col. Carl Robbins, Lt. Col. O. A. Waller, Capt. Hal Chapman, all of Eugene, assisted him and a corps of civilian clerks and assistants helped in the work.

The Lane county quota will be billeted at the armory Monday night and will be sent out Tuesday. The group from Albany will arrive here Tuesday and will be billeted at the armory Tuesday night before entraining Wednesday for the trip to Steamboat camp. The men will complete the Steamboat personnel and will bring the camp population to its full quota. The Oakridge camp was the first to receive its full quota of men.

No Training Work Needed
The Lane county boys will be sent direct to the camp and will not go to an army post for conditioning. Nineteen Lane county men selected as woodsmen by the forestry department were sent out several days ago.

"Sales Rackets" Operating Here, Chamber Reports

Many complaints regarding rackets having to do with fake stock schemes have been received by the better business bureau of the Eugene chamber of commerce recently, and a warning against these rackets was issued by the bureau Monday.

Several persons are said to have been caught on fake stock deals for coal mines recently. In this and the oil well rackets, the salesman approaches the customer with a story of a newly opened concern, or in some cases operating concerns, in need of new money for expansion and development. The stock is sold at an attractive price with promises of quick profit.

In the nursery racket, the salesman approaches a customer with the proposition of buying a group of shrubs at a nominal price, grows them for six months with the promise of buying them back at that time at a good profit. Persons who have bought these shrubs have reported the salesman disappeared soon afterward. People are urged to communicate with the better business bureau before investing any money in these schemes.

Man and Mules are Thrown Into River

While Dee Wright, veteran guide, was taking a party of government men up the South Fork of the McKenzie Sunday a landslide precipitated several of the pack mules and one or two of the men into the swift flowing stream and it was with difficulty that they were extricated, according to word received here. None of the men were injured, it was stated.

The South Fork is now quite high, due to melting snow, and is a swift and dangerous stream. The heavy rains of Saturday had loosened the dirt and rocks above the road and the jar caused by the cavalcade passing along the road caused the slide.

Hoarders List Put In Hands Of U.S. Agents

WASHINGTON, June 5.—(AP)—Attorney General Cummings said today he had transmitted to the field offices of the bureau of investigation more than 1000 names of suspected gold hoarders with a view to compelling compliance with President Roosevelt's order that all gold or gold certificates above \$100 be returned to the treasury.

The attorney general denounced those still holding gold as "recalcitrant citizens who are not doing their full duty to their country."

The attorney general said agents of the bureau of investigation would inquire immediately of those on the list whether they still had the gold or gold certificates in their possession.

If so, the holder will be advised specifically to turn in his gold immediately and the criminal section of the president's order providing a fine of \$10,000 or 10 years in prison or both called to his attention.

The attorney general said this course was taken to prevent, in the event of prosecution, the gold holder from advancing the "specious claim" that he had never heard of the law.

If the holder contends the gold has left his possession, the disposition of it is to be traced.

SNOW PLOW CREW HITS BIG DRIFTS

Measurements Indicate Big Job Ahead of Workers On McKenzie

From a few inches to 18 feet of snow will be encountered by the state snow plow crew at work moving the snow from the McKenzie highway over the summit section. Measurements taken on May 31 by members of the crew from the west snow line over the summit east show that on level stretches where the snow has not drifted the depths range from 5 to 7 feet but the drifts are 11, 12 and 16 feet deep and one of them is 18.

There is more snow than usual for this time of year and it is frozen about as hard as usual, according to the men making the measurements. In the deepest places the snow is frozen pretty solidly and it will be much more difficult to remove than in some of the other spots.
